




UPCOMING TOURS AND EVENTS

Exit Route 83 south. On Route 83 south take the Roosevelt Road/Butterfield Road East Exit, follow signs to Drury Lane.

Take the Eisenhower Expressway/I-290 West to I-88 West. Pay toll and exit at Cermak Road. Proceed through the stoplight so you are heading north. Continue on Spring Road and bear right onto Drury Lane Street. Drury Lane will be on your left at the end of the road.

When Approaching From The West On I-88:

Exit at Midwest Road, turn right, proceed to Butterfield Road and turn right. Proceed to Drury Lane exit.

When Approaching From I-294:

Exit I-88 West. Pay toll, exit at Cermak Road. Proceed through the stoplight so you are heading north. Continue on Spring Road and bear right onto Drury Lane Street. Drury Lane will be on your left at the end of the road.

Happy V-8 Anniversary to Don & Elaine Braun

Thirty-five years ago this month, Don & Elaine Braun joined the Northern Illinois Regional Group. Over the years Don & Elaine have been valued members of the club, serving in many ways. They have hosted the annual club picnic many times at their home in Prairie View and for that the club will always be grateful. Don & Elaine are "regulars" at club events and have driven their V-8's to quite a number of Early Ford V-8 Club national meets, beginning with the first Grand National Meet in Dearborn in 1973.

We sat down with Don recently and discussed his V-8 Fords and other antique cars, as well as his experiences with the club. We are grateful for the following narrative that Don provided, as well as access to several photo albums that helped illustrate his many years with the club.


Back in 1972, I met Jack Groot at a car show where he was giving out applications to join the V-8 club. I went to my first meeting at a Ford dealership where Chester Lawrence worked. I had a 1940 Ford Pickup that I had bought for \$100 that I was working on at the time.

After going to a couple of meetings, I joined the club in October. I was appointed to help club President Len O'Connor with some of the tours. Our first club tour was to the first Grand National Meet in Dearborn in June 1973.

Over the years I restored my 1941 Lincoln Zephyr, I bought a 1940 Tudor Deluxe Sedan from George Anderton, which I later used as a partial trade for my 1936 5 Window Coupe. Now I have a 1956 Pickup I restored to go along with my '36.

After 35 years in the club, we have come to feel this club is like family. Don

Don bought his '40 pickup in December 1969. The picture above left is the truck as it existed in August 1970. The picture on the right is after





restoration – the color is brown. Don drove the '40 to the first Grand National Meet in Dearborn in 1973. We aren't sure if Don will admit to what was under the hood at the time – you'll need to ask him.

On the right is Don's 1941 Lincoln Zephyr Club Coupe. Don bought the Lincoln in 1968 and restored it over the years. He sold it in 1983. This picture was taken in July 1982. Check out those gas prices!

Of course, the car we most associate with Don in recent years is the '36 Five Window Coupe. Don told us that he was after this car for some time. He finally was able to buy it in 1987 or 1988 and had to trade a '40 Ford, a Lincoln, and a truck for it. This beautiful '36 with its built engine has won trophies at many V-8 Club National Meets.

'56 pickup. This was a work truck that Don bought from a young man in Libertyville for \$1,000 back in 1985. (Who is that kid standing by the truck?) Don completed restoration of the truck around 2000 and drives it to various car shows and other events. Just this July it captured a trophy at the American Legion car show in Arlington Heights.





Lake Geneva Classic Car Rally By Ken Bounds

The Lake Geneva Classic Car Rally was different this year. It was not the weather, which was fantastic – maybe the best ever. It was not the participants, and there were many. It was not the route, or the restaurants, or the entertainment. Something was missing. That something was the man who was the face and the heart of the Rally for the previous 29 years. We were shocked to learn this past April that George Kreissl had died suddenly, not long after being diagnosed with cancer. George and Jan Kreissl started the Rally 30 years ago in the name of their infant daughter Corrine and have raised nearly \$700,000 in the fight against childhood cancer.

The Rally has been a regular event on the NIRG calendar for many years and is one of the last

driving tours each year. George, his family, and many volunteers have put on a premier event with self-guided driving tours around the lakes, various events and entertainment over the weekend, highlighted by a large classic car and antique airplane show on Sunday. We will always remember George working tirelessly as the emcee of the Sunday program which capped off the weekend with awards for the poker hands and dozens of donated door prizes. This year after a moving opening statement, Jan turned over the program to her niece, who did a terrific job. We should be pleased that by the end of the weekend, members of the NIRG had donated over \$900 to this very worthy cause.

Some members of the NIRG make this a three-day weekend event, while others join the fun on Sunday for breakfast and the car show. On Friday, September 28, Dick & Dot Alfini in their '51 Convertible, Ken & Carolyn Bounds in their '50 Convertible, Joe & Nell Kozmic in their '37 Coupe, and Joey Novak in his '40 Pickup met in Arlington Heights for a drive over scenic backroads to Delavan, WI. TECH CORNER



Our technical tip this month is all about safety.

Always remember safety precautions when working under a car. In the illustration below, we see how our safety-conscious flathead mechanic has cautiously placed a wheel chock behind the right-rear wheel while welding his gas tank, preventing any chance that the truck will roll away, causing it to fall off the supports. It just goes to show that you can never be too careful.



In our next illustration, we see how our mechanic has carefully supported the flathead with two bricks under the water pumps before firing it up. Again, note the wheel chock which prevents any sort of dangerous mishap.

V-8 Gals

Halloween is my favorite holiday. Ken will argue with me that Halloween is not a holiday, but I disagree. As part of the holiday festivities, I enjoy carving pumpkins. By the fourth day my pumpkin is looking pretty sad. It is all shriveled up and parts of it have become squirrel food. This year I vowed to do something about it. I went on-line looking for tips on how to make my carved pumpkins last longer. Here are some tips that I hope help will help you too.

- Washing the inside of your pumpkin with a mild bleach solution will slow the process of decay. Any time you have a wet pumpkin you want to display, you should immediately dry it off to prevent mold from growing.
- Coat all of the exposed flesh of the pumpkin with petroleum jelly immediately after carving, including a light coating of the entire inside of the pumpkin. The most important thing is to coat the design that you've carved. You can use a Q-tip to rub the petroleum jelly on all of the cut parts to make your creation last much longer.
- You can usually restore a shrunk pumpkin back to its original condition by soaking it in cold water overnight. If the pumpkin is carved, put the carved part face-down. Let the pumpkin float, and let the insides fill with water. After 8 hours or so, the pumpkin will absorb the water and become very firm.

I didn't find too much to keep the squirrels away. The best tips were to rub red pepper flakes inside the pumpkin, put something noisy, like aluminum foil near your pumpkin to annoy the squirrels or put a decoy pumpkin out in the yard closer to the squirrels for them to munch on.

FABULOUS PUMPKIN CHEESE CAKE BARS

1 (16 oz.) pkg. pound cake mix	3 eggs	
2 tbsp. butter, melted	4 tsp. pumpkin pie spice	
1 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese, soft	1 (14 oz.) can Eagle Brand condensed milk (not evaporated)	
1 (16 oz.) can pumpkin	1 c. chopped nuts	
1/2 tsp. salt		

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In large bowl on low, combine cake mix, 1 egg, butter, 2 teaspoons pumpkin spice, until crumbly. Press onto bottom of 15 x 10 inch jelly roll pan. Set aside. In large bowl, beat cream cheese until fluffy. Gradually beat in condensed milk, then remaining 2 eggs, 2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice and salt. Mix well. Pour over crust and sprinkle with nuts on top. Bake 30-35 minutes or until set. Cut into bars. Store in refrigerator.





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
