Tour to Sanfilippo Victorian Palace: *Place de la Musique* By Ken Bounds

On August 18 over 20 NIRG members and guests were treated to a tour that for most people could be described as an opportunity of a lifetime. We had the rare chance to tour the Sanfilippo 'Place de la Musique', known worldwide for its magnificent collections of beautifully restored antique music machines, phonographs, arcade and gambling machines, chandeliers, art glass, the world's largest restored theatre pipe organ, the most spectacular European salon carousel in existence, street and tower clocks, steam engines and other functional mechanical antiques, displayed within a breathtaking French Second Empire setting. Our thanks go out to Ron Dopke for arranging this event and to the Chicago Art Deco Society



for inviting us to join them and the Chicago Area Theatre Organ Enthusiasts group on this fabulous tour.



While most visitors had to park their cars along the winding driveway of the 57-acre estate, our NIRG vehicles were treated to a place of prominence along the circular driveway at the front entrance. As the crowd of over 100 waited to go inside, many of the Art Deco Society members spent some time examining and complimenting our fine V-8's.

Our tour began by entering the magnificent main entry foyer and into the music room, which houses innumerable antique music machines, highlighted by the massive 8,000-pipe theatre organ. Our tour guides for the day were a son and a son-in-law of owner Jasper Sanfilippo who also visited with us and was a gracious host. As one of the guides welcomed the three groups who were on the tour, we were surprised by a round of applause from the group for our cars!

room to share cannot adequately describe the musical treasures and elegant appointments in this home. TECH CORNER

**Reprinted from the Central Indiana Group's *Hoosier Views*.**

Considering restoring a classic car or just polishing up your car? Here's how to repair a paint chip:

1. Purchase touch-up paint for your car. (For the correct paint, see your Owner Manual.)
2. Purchase a small amount of automotive clear coat.
3. Wash the area surrounding the paint chip and dry it thoroughly.
4. Using a small soft brush or Q-tip, clean out the paint chip.
5. Shake up the touch-up paint.
6. Take a paper match and trim the non-lightable end to a point. Matches work well for applying paint.
7. Apply a small amount of paint to the chip. Try not to get any on the surrounding paint.
8. Allow the touch-up paint to dry thoroughly, then apply a layer of clear coat over the touch-up paint.
9. Allow the clear coat to dry then apply a second layer. You want to build the clear coat up higher than the surrounding paint.
10. Allow the paint to dry for 24 hours.
11. Using 1500-grit sand paper, lightly sand the area. Make sure there is no dirt on the car or the sandpaper. This will cause scratches.
12. Using 2000-grit sand paper, sand the area again until smooth.
13. Finish the process using a fine polishing compound on a soft cloth. This will bring back the shine.
14. If you can still see swirl marks, try a car cleaner polish or a cleaner wax with a fine abrasive.
15. The paint chip should now be gone and very hard to see. Only you will know where it was.

Tips:

Always check your Owner Manual and Service Manual before beginning any repair. Don't be in a hurry. Make sure the paint is 100 percent dry before sanding. Only sand a very small area surrounding the paint chip. Don't go crazy. Sand only in one direction; do not go round in circles. For best repair results, make sure to reference the Factory Repair Manual. Visit www.helminc.com for the manuals you need.

35 Years Ago This Month – September 1972

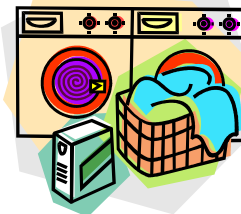

Have you ever bought some new clothes and then were totally clueless as to what the fabric care symbols meant? Here are a few from <http://www.thefabricofourlives.com> that should help decipher the code.

	Machine Wash Permanent Press	Article should be laundered only on the Permanent Press setting, which has a cool down or cold rinse prior to reduced spin.
	Machine Wash Gentle (or Delicate)	Article should be laundered only on the Gentle setting; which has a gentler agitation and/or a reduced duration.
	Iron All Temperatures, Steam or Dry	Article can be ironed using any temperature setting, with or without steam
	Iron, Low	Article can be ironed on the Low setting, with or without steam.
	Iron, Medium	Article can be ironed on the Medium setting only, with or without steam.
	Iron, High	Article can be ironed on the High setting only, with or without steam.
	Tumble Dry, Normal	Article can be regularly dried at the highest temperature setting.
	Tumble Dry, Normal Low Heat	Article can be regularly dried in a machine dryer set on the Low Heat setting.
	Tumble Dry, Normal Medium Heat	Article can be regularly dried in a machine dryer set on the Medium Heat setting.
	Tumble Dry, Normal High Heat	Article can be regularly dried in a machine dryer set on the High Heat setting.
	Tumble Dry, Permanent Press	Article can be dried in a machine dryer using the Permanent Press setting.
	Tumble Dry, Gentle	Article can be dried regularly in a machine dryer using the Gentle setting.
	Line Dry	Article must be dried on a clothesline or bar, indoors or outside.
	Drip Dry	Article should be hung dripping wet from clothesline or bar, inside or outside; do not hand shape.
	Dry Flat	Lay article out horizontally to dry.
	Dry in Shade	This symbol is usually an addition to the Line or Drip Dry symbol and indicates that the article should be dried out of direct sunlight.

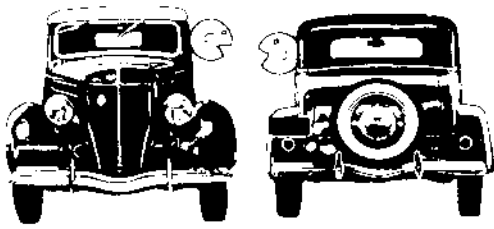
