Motorfest IV - Auburn, IN, August 23 - 26

The Motorfest has an exciting schedule this year. It starts off on Saturday with a cruise-in around the town square in Auburn, followed by a Welcome Party featuring a baby back rib or vegetarian dinner.

On Sunday there will be a tour to Wabash, IN, to visit 3 museums and have a Sunday Brunch. The round trip will be approximately 134 miles. The Dr. James Ford Historic Home offers an interpretation of a 19th Century surgeons home and career highlights. The Wabash County museum has displays of life with native Americans and transportation including canal boats, wagons, trains and cars. The third museum is the Charley Creek Gardens. On the way back to Auburn, we will visit the Roann Covered Bridge to have a "Kodak Moment".

Monday's tour will be to Howe, IN. The round trip is about 90 miles. We will visit the Greenfield Mill. It is one of the few flour mills powered by water. Another stop on the tour is Orland, IN, where Clydesdale horses are bred and shown and the Great American Mercantile Store is situated. After lunch, we will tour to Angola and visit the Satek Winery for wine tasting before returning to Auburn.

Tuesday morning will be the Foundation Meeting and free time to visit the local museums. The Poker Run starts at 12:30. At 5:30 pm the cash bar at the Kruse museum will open and you will be free to tour both the WWII Victory Museum and the Kruse Automotive and Carriage Museum. Dinner will be at 7:00 pm.

The group rate for rooms during the Motorfest is \$69 a night. Registration fee is \$75 per family.

Tom O'Donnell had rubber vulcanized onto the running boards for his 1940 Mercury. Tom showed how the vulcanizing process covers slight imperfections in a restored board. The boards were restored by Hunley Aucliff, 1423 Wilson Rd., Rossville, GA 30741.

Tom thought it was worth paying the extra approx \$50.00 per running board to let Mr. Aucliff sand blast the boards, so he could properly prep them for the vulcanizing process. He has molds for all antique running boards.

Ken Bounds showed a 36 running board he purchased from Bob Drake reproductions. He found the quality to be good even though the boards are fabricated in China. The cost is \$850 per pair.

TECH CORNER



From the Editors:

While we try to keep the information in the Road Chatter new and original, in this month's Tech Corner we are making an exception. Last November we published a tech article about using a bright LED third brakelight. Member Roger Obecny recently suggested that we reprint another brakelight tech tip from the archives about proper grounding and other tips to improve lights.

We are happy to do just that on the 20th anniversary of this tip provided by long-time member Chester Lawrence. This is also a reminder that there are many members out there who are a treasure-trove of knowledge about our beloved V-8's and we need your contributions. Chester contributed many, many articles to the Road Chatter over the years under the name of "The Flathead". It's time for you who have the knowledge to share it with your fellow members. We would love to have your tech contributions for future issues and for newer members who did not have the privilege of seeing these old columns.

Here it is, from the May 1988 Road Chatter:

Tail and stop lights on Early Fords are low to the ground and difficult to see at best. I've seen some in the past year that were no brighter than a glowing cigarette.

This is usually a voltage loss due to poor grounding of the lamp to the base and fender. I can never talk myself into scraping away enough paint to properly ground each piece to the next, so here's my solution.

Remove the lens and bulb - don't drop it! I fold a blanket and lay it on the floor first. Thread a #12 or #14 wire through the same loom the tail and stop light wires are in, and pull enough through to reach a hidden place along the upper frame rail. Drill a small hole in the upper frame or rear cross member, install a round wire connector and attach to the frame with a self tapping bolt. Using an electric soldering iron, solder the upper end of the wire to the socket base inside the lamp. Take a small paint brush and paint the inside of the lamp with aluminum paint. Do not use a spray can, or you may cause a short if aluminum paint is on the wires or socket. Reinstall the bulb and lens, and make sure the lens gasket won't let moisture into the lamp.

The tail and stop lights should be at least 50% brighter. Headlights through 1939 can be improved using the same method. There are also sockets and quartz halogen bulbs available through street rod parts stores. These make much brighter headlights, and can be used with the original reflectors and lenses through 1939.
