A couple of his key points were: it is *very* important to have a current appraisal by an independent, certified appraiser. This will help in the unfortunate event of an insurance claim, even with an “agreed value” policy. Frank defined a “current” appraisal as one done within the last 2 years, but suggested appraising more frequently in a rapidly rising market. He also suggested appraising at major milestones during a restoration to capture the value added to the car during the process. The talk also covered the safety checklist required to title and license a kit car, and the certification requirements for appraisers. Frank offers NIRG members a discount.

TECH CORNER

For this month's tech corner we offer a new source for some of the electrical components for the Borg-Warner overdrive units used on 1949 and later Fords. These can be vital parts for keeping our Flathead V-8's out on the road.

Last year on the trip back from Dearborn I had a problem the overdrive relay on my '50 Crestliner. So, I was interested when the following posting showed up this week on the Fordbarn website, <http://www.fordbarn.com/earlyv8/forum03/ev8forum.htm>, about using a headlight relay to replace the "guts" of a faulty relay:

My overdrive relay was closing the contacts, but not letting enough power through to engage the solenoid. Trying to find a new relay was nearly impossible, and when I did find one it was very expensive. I was surfing and found a guy with a 50 Studebaker that had the exact problem I did. He had a solution of putting inside the overdrive relay box a modern relay. He used a radio shack 12 volt relay. I've attached the article. He has the part number wrong. The correct part number is 275-226. I tried this relay and it worked some of the time. I looked and finally found a 6 volt relay, rated 20-30 amps. It is a heavy duty headlight relay. I got it from Fifth Avenue Antique Auto Parts. 785-632-3450. Part number 03415HL6. It was \$26.00 + \$5.00 shipping. I ground off the mounting tab and drilled out the holes in the contacts and soldered my wires to the contacts. I have an Autolite relay and the cover was not quite as big as the Ford overdrive relay. This relay was a bit smaller than the Radio Shack relay and fit better. Just came back from an 8 hour road trip and the relay worked perfect. I have received so much help from you guys. I hope this can help someone.

I went to the Fifth Avenue Internet Garage website to check out the headlight relay and found that it was still available, now priced at \$27.00. But I was surprised to find even better news. They are now selling a new "exact" reproduction of the original Borg-Warner relay. The price of \$126 may seem a little steep, but good used relays are hard to find and what would it be worth to you when you are on the side of the road? The 6-volt relay is part number 08415ODR6. They also are available in 12 volt. So the choice is yours: you can buy the headlight relay and use a little engineering and solder to adapt it to an existing overdrive case, or spend \$100 more and get a brand new unit.



But wait, there's more! Fifth Avenue is also selling new reproduction overdrive solenoids that should fit many of our Fords (probably not convertibles, which use a different unit). These items are also getting very scarce and pricey. The new unit is being sold for \$265. You can sometimes find original solenoids at swap meets, but they typically sell for \$150 or more and you really don't know if they work correctly until they are installed on your car and subjected to the heat generated by the transmission and electrical current on a long drive.

V-8 Gals

February 6 is the American Heart Association's National Wear Red Day. The Go Red for Women Day is to raise awareness of heart disease and prevention. Heart disease is the number 1 killer of American women.

Do you know the warning signs of a heart attack?

- ♥ **Chest discomfort.** Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.
- ♥ **Discomfort in other areas of the upper body.** Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- ♥ **Shortness of breath** with or without chest discomfort.
- ♥ **Other signs** may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness

As with men, women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. But women are somewhat more likely than men to experience some of the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting, and back or jaw pain.

HERSHEY'S Best Brownies

- 1 cup (2 sticks) butter or margarine
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 4 eggs
- 3/4 cup HERSHEY'S Cocoa or HERSHEY'S SPECIAL DARK Cocoa
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup chopped nuts (optional)

1. Heat oven to 350°F. Grease 13x9x2-inch baking pan.
2. Place butter in large microwave-safe bowl. Microwave at MEDIUM (50%) 2 to 2-1/2 minutes or until melted. Stir in sugar and vanilla. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well with spoon after each addition. Add cocoa; beat until well blended. Add flour, baking powder and salt; beat well. Stir in nuts, if desired. Pour batter into prepared pan.
3. Bake 30 to 35 minutes or until brownies begin to pull away from sides of pan. Cool completely in pan on wire rack. Frost if desired. Cut into bars. About 36 brownies.

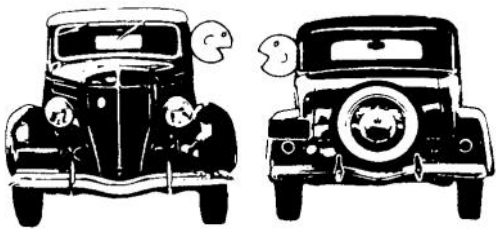
