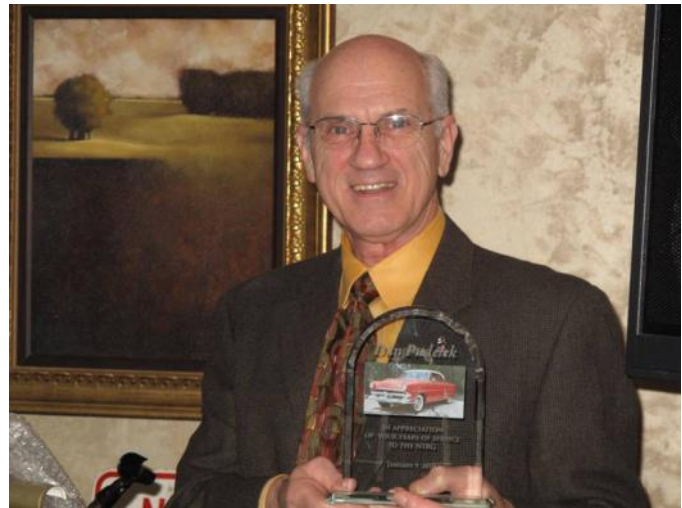

TECH CORNER

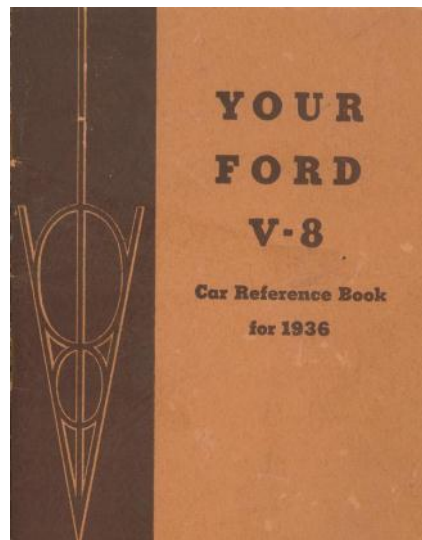
2011 is the 75th anniversary of the 1936 Ford. We hope you like the following interesting technical information and historical facts about this classic model.

Firsts

- Pressed-steel “wide-five” wheels; gone were wire wheels
- Concealed horns hidden behind grills
- Club Cabriolet brought all passengers inside and spelled eventual doom for the rumble seat.
- First year for accessory banjo steering wheel

Lasts

- Last year for fabric top insert
- Last year for battery mounted under floor pan
- Last year for outside-mounted spare tire
- Last year for externally-mounted headlights
- Last year for the three-window coupe
- Last year for removable windshields on Roadsters and Phaetons
- Last year for babbitted main bearings (engine with replaceable bearings introduced October 1935 and produced alongside the “babbit” engine for the rest of year)



Technical Specifications

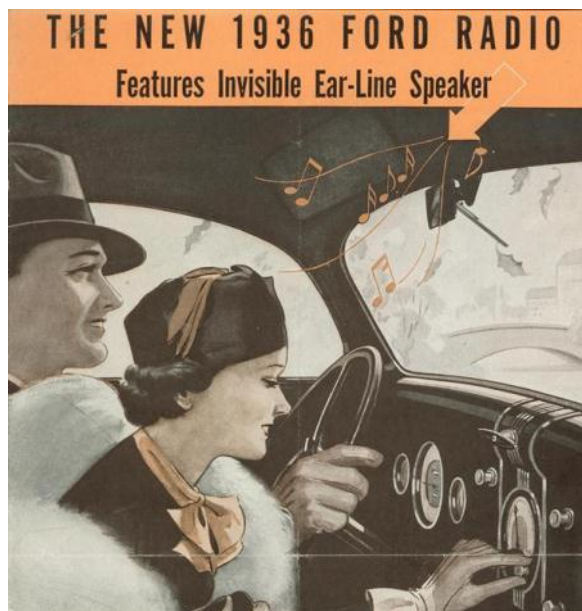
- Price – starting at \$510 for the Five window coupe to \$780 for the Convertible Sedan.
- Most expensive accessory – Radio at an outlandish \$44.50, installed. Payment plan available!
- Weight – ranged from 2,561 lbs for the Roadster to 3,020 lbs for the Station Wagon
- Engine – reliable 221 cubic inch Flathead V-8 rated at 85 horsepower
- Introduced – October 1935
- Serial numbers – Beginning – 18-2,207,111
End – 18-3,331,856
- Production totals – 791,812; Fewest-Deluxe Roadster, 3,862; Most-Standard Tudor Sedan, 174,470

Accomplishments

- Ford produced its 3 millionth V-8 engine in May 1936
- A Ford V-8 Special was the overall winner of the 1936 Monte Carlo Rally

Engineering

- Largest number of body styles of the V-8 era, 15 counting the Station Wagon
- With the help of Allegheny Ludlum, Ford produced six Tudor Sedans with bodies made of stainless steel. Four of them are known to exist today.

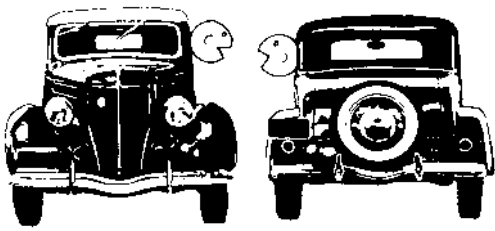
