

Illinois Legislative Update - Expanded Use Antique Vehicle Plates

One year ago we told you about a pending bill in the Illinois legislature to provide for expanded use Antique Vehicle license plates that would allow full use of the vehicle from April 1 through October 31, rather than the extremely limited use requirements currently imposed on vehicles with antique plates. The new plates will cost \$45 per year.

The good news is that the law passed the legislature last year and was signed into law by Governor Quinn, effective January 1, 2012. Unfortunately, neither the Secretary of State license offices nor the Secretary's "Cyberdrive Illinois" website have any information about obtaining these plates. At the Chicago Auto Show in February, I discussed the new plates with an administrator from the Special Plates Division in the Secretary of State's office who assured me that the website would be updated in March. She has just responded to my recent inquiry stating that the website will be updated April 4.



Where Are They Now?

This is the first in our series of articles about members' Early V-8s that have been featured in past editions of the newsletter. What follows is the very first article about a member vehicle as published 40 years ago in the March 1972 newsletter. The introduction was written by Newsletter Editor Ron Dopke.

Here is the first of our new features regarding club members cars. As might have been expected, President Len O'Connor was the first to respond. Our sincere thanks to Len and his pioneering spirit. Let's hope his example will stir others to action. There must be some good stories on the subject. Won't you have share yours with us? But now, on to the saga of Len O'Connor's 1932 DeLuxe Convertible Coupe.

My 1932 V-8 Cabriolet

I acquired my first '32 convertible through an ad in Hemmings Motor News. It was in Bethesda, Maryland. I called the fellow on the phone and got a complete description of the car. It sounded too good to be true, everything I asked about had the right answer. Only one drawback, a fellow in Windsor, Canada had tentatively agreed to buy the car but wanted to come look at it first. I hung up and the wife and I talked it over. I called him back about an hour later and tried to persuade him to sell me the car sight unseen.

He finally agreed that if he had the money by the following morning, he would close the deal. He would have to phone the man in Windsor to tell him it was sold, before he made plans to fly in and see it.

The next morning the wife was at the bank when it opened and had the money sent via Western Union. He had agreed that as soon as he received the money, he would wire me a receipt in return showing the title number, etc. I thought this would assure me the car was mine and couldn't be sold to someone else, as it would be about 6 weeks before I could pick the car up. I received the receipt the same day and about a week later I received some color photos of the car, inside and out. After looking at the pictures, I was even more elated over the purchase I had made.

We started making plans for the trip to get the car. I decided to tow bar it home, as I had done with several other cars in the past. I borrowed a couple of 1932 wheels with good rubber, in case of any tire trouble. He said he had just installed a new Sears battery and all lights were in good working order. He also had the transmission and rear end checked for fluid and new anti-freeze put in the radiator. About the middle of February we started for Maryland, hoping for good weather. We were going and returning on the tollways so we thought even if it did snow we wouldn't be too bad off. We picked Cleveland, Ohio as the halfway point and stayed there overnight. The next morning we started for Bethesda getting in to town late in the afternoon. I called and made arrangements to see the car the following morning. The fellow had told us of a nice motel that was convenient to everything and also not too far from him.

The next morning we were there at the prescribed time anxious to see what we had bought, sight unseen. He opened the garage door and there she sat, I walked around her once and was sure I had made a great buy. His first words were, "If you aren't satisfied, I'll be glad to give you your money back." I said, "No, I had bought it for better orfor worse."

The response to his ad had been more than his expectations. Some had offered considerably more money for the car than he had asked for in the ad. I asked him if I could leave the car there for a couple more days and he agreed.

We thought we would mix business and pleasure as long as we were surrounded by so many historical sights.

For the next couple of days we took in as much as we could see, mostly on tours. We thought we would see more in this fashion then on our own. Some of the highlights were the Embassy Row, Capital Building, Lincoln Memorial, Arlington National Cemetery, Smithsonian Institute and the U.S. Mint where the paper money and stamps are printed. (We couldn't get out with any samples though).

Then, early one morning, we hooked the tow bar to our new purchase and started home. Again, staying in Cleveland over night and on home the next day. Not one bit of trouble and dry pavement all the way! It was cold though, -10 degrees in Cleveland.

I didn't do much that summer except dispose of the four (4) 1939 Fords that I had. The following summer I started disassembling the 1932 down to the bare frame and started from there. The engine was rebuilt by Surburban Auto Parts in Maywood. Mains were poured and align bored, new camshaft, rebored .030 and all new component parts. The number of the motor matches the number on the frame so I know it is the original motor.

As of now, the chassis is almost complete except for a few minor things such as brake rods and adjustments. Then it will be ready for the body.

I am anxiously awaiting warm weather to get some paint on the body, so it can be set back on the chassis. The upholstery is being done by LeBerron Bonney, so that leaves only the top to deal with. I'm hoping to have it on the road later in the summer. As many of you know, I have since acquired another 1932 Ford Convertible but that will have to be in another letter later.

I have repurchased a 1939 Deluxe Coupe that I sold a few years ago, to use in our outings this summer, and hope to see more of you at some of the Club functions come warm weather. Happy motoring with the Early V-8's.

OK - this is the first in our *Where Are They Now?* series. And if you read Page 9, you already know part of the answer! Although Len predicted the '32 would be on the road that summer, it was not.

When Gary Osborne sent us an inquiry about joining the NIRG he said: "I am in the process of restoring my first car and could probably use a little help and advise from some of your members. The car that I own also has a connection to your club. It was one of the cars that Len O'Connor (charter member and past president) owned a long time ago. He disassembled it in 1963 and never put it back together." We forwarded Gary a copy of the story reprinted above and received the following response: "I just read your e-mail, and I sure was surprised to find out that the story that Len wrote was about the car that I have. He never did finish the chassis completely or paint and install the body. The other 32 that he purchased was the one that he finally finished. As a matter of fact I think that he put the engine that he rebuilt into the other car and not mine (#s don't match, so my engine must be out of his second car, too bad)." Summary of the Early Ford V-8 Club Board of Directors Meeting February 2012 - San Diego, CA Prepared by Midwest Director Ken Bounds

The annual "face-to-face" meeting of the National Board of Directors of the Early Ford V-8 Club of America was held February 22 -23, 2012 in San Diego, CA. The Board thanks the San Diego Regional Group and especially V-8 Times Editor Jerry Windle, for their work in setting up and hosting the meeting. At a reception he night before the meeting, plaques were presented to outgoing President Bob

York and Northeast Director Arel Brown for their service (outgoing CA/Southwest Director John Connelly was not present). We also had the ceremonial passing of the gavel from Bob to incoming President Ken Bounds.

As the official meeting got underway, 2010 President Arel Brown swore in the 2012 officers, including President Ken Bounds, returning Vice President Don Singleterry and Secretary Steve Lemmons, along with new Directors Tom Gormley of Connecticut and Tom Johnston of California and re-elected Directors Lynn Stringer of Michigan and Lou Mraz of Colorado.

National Chief Judge and Deputies – The Board confirmed the appointment to three-year terms of National Chief Judge John McBurney, Deputy National Chief Judges Scot Kohler (West), Jerry Vincentini (Central) and Ray Beebe (East), and Alternate Deputy National Chief Judge Craig Gorris.

<u>Annual Roster Submission</u> – The By-Laws were clarified to state that each Regional Group will forward their roster as of June 1 to their respective Director by July 1 annually.

<u>Club Book Sales</u> – Sales of club books and accessories are ahead of projections, but because of the significant stock of certain books, the Board voted to provide copies of the V-8 Cookbook for the goody bags of each registrant for 2012 National Meets, and copies of the V-8 Cookbook, the Grease Pit Poet, and the "old" 1932 Ford Book to registrants for the 2013 Grand National Meet. The Board also voted to make a package of one set of the entire library of Club books available to each Regional Group at a steeply discounted price of \$300 per set, shipping included.

<u>Club Website</u> – Outgoing Director John Connelly, who along with his wife Margaret were instrumental in the significant improvements in the <u>Club website</u>, have turned over management to new Director Tom Johnston. Bruce Nelson, who was named by Board in 2011 as the website administrator, has completed his training by the Connellys and has taken over daily administration. The Club is indebted to the Connellys for their accomplishments.

<u>Technical Books</u> – Progress continues on the 1940 Ford Book, the 1952-1953 Ford Book, and the 1949-1951 Mercury Book. Development has begun on the Flathead Engine Book. North-Central Director Lou Mraz presented the latest revisions to the Technical Book Guidelines.

National Meets - The Eastern National meet in Hiawassee, Georgia, is on track with 145 registrations.

The Central National meet August 20-23 in Branson, Missouri, is being put on by the National Board of

Directors; John McBurney and Bruce Nelson co-chairmen. The board of directors is experimenting with Cornerstone Registration, which handles V-8 Club membership, to handle the meet registration. This is a new concept that has the potential to be adapted for future meets. It may ease the registration process and remove that burden from the hosting regional group.

The Western National meet in Redmond, Oregon, is moving along smoothly with over 130 registrations.

The Grand National meet, June 16-20, 2013, in Lake Tahoe, California, is progressing on schedule. The Golden Gate Regional Group #1 is working hard on this meet. The hotels of Harrah's (host hotel) and Harvey's will be the two main hotels.

The Board approved a bid from the National Capital Regional Group to host the 2014 Eastern National meet June 1-4, 2014, in Aberdeen, Maryland.

<u>National Tour Program</u> – Director Lou Mraz presented a proposal to test a National Tour Program in 2012 with the inaugural tour being along the Great River Road in the upper Midwest.

<u>Judging Standards Committee</u> – Ken Bounds reported the JSC has determined that Rouge Class judging sheets will be reviewed with and signed by car owners. Due to safety concerns replacement wiring will be allowed as needed in Rouge Class.

75th ANNIVERSARY

75th Anniversary Program – This program will continue with the owner of each 1937 Ford shown at a 2012 National Meet being presented with a certificate and commemorative license tab. A prototype of the tab was shown to the board and the order of tabs approved. No tabs will be available for sale until after the Eastern National Meet.

<u>Driving Certificate</u> - The Board clarified the intention to present a certificate to any member who drives their Early V-8 to all National Meets in a year, except for Grand National Years. Eligibility will be determined by reviewing the sheets of attendees requesting mileage bars.

<u>Club Advertising</u> – The Board is looking for a volunteer who has marketing experience to help advertise the V-8 Club and its events. An article will be placed in upcoming issued of the *V-8 Times* requesting volunteer members with marketing experience to assist with club promotion.

<u>Directors and Officers Liability Insurance</u> – Northeast Director Tom Gormley reported that about 40 Regional Groups applied for the insurance.

<u>Financial Statements</u> – The Board approved a proposal to publish a summary financial statement annually in the *V-8 Times*. The first statement should appear in the March-April issue.

<u>V-8 Club 50th Anniversary</u> – Arel Brown reported on various plans to commemorate the Club's 50th anniversary. Special clothing items, commemorative license toppers and related memorabilia will be available. Bob York reported on plans for a raffle car. Steve Lemmons presented an outline of an anniversary book; Henry Dominguez is willing to be the author. Arel discussed the planned National Tour across the Lincoln Highway to the Grand National Meet.

<u>V-8 Times Archive Scanning</u> – Dan Wittern reported that scanning of the *V-8 Times* is nearly competed. The board will now look for ways to promote the availability of scanned material.

<u>Upcoming Board Meetings</u> – The next meeting, May 19, will be a second face-to-face in Houston. Conference calls are tentatively scheduled for August 11 and November 17. The Board tentatively plans to hold the 2013 face-to-face meeting February 12-13 in the Santa Rosa/Napa, CA, area.



It's that time of year again. It's time for spring cleaning! I'm not a fan but I always feel a great sense of satisfaction when I have cleaned the house from top to bottom. I'm always on the lookout for new tips and tricks. I came across this list from the people at Readers Digest. I plan on giving some of these a try. Hope they work out for you too!

Top 10 Cleaning Tips You've Never Tried!

1. Blinds

The best way to dust blinds is to close them and then wipe up and down with an old dryer sheet. This not only captures the dust, but also leaves an antistatic barrier that helps prevent dust from forming.

2. Walls

Use a Mr. Clean Magic Eraser to get those scuff marks off your walls.

3. Glass and mirrors

Use coffee filters, not paper towels, to clean glass and mirrors because they leave no streaks or lint.



4. Bathroom shower

Combine half white distilled vinegar and half water in a spray bottle and spray the shower as you're getting out and the shower walls are still wet. The vinegar absorbs the odors of a musty bathroom, and the vinegar odor disappears in an hour or so.

5. Oven

Clean your oven with a wet pumice stone. It will do the job much faster than a spray-on product.

6. Wood floors

When damp-mopping wood floors use only tap water or a water-based floor cleaner. Never use vinegar on wood floors! It contains acid, which will pit the polyurethane finish and may reduce shine over time. (If you have a new wood floor, using vinegar on it could void the warranty.)

7. Microwave oven

To clean the microwave oven, mix one tablespoon of baking soda with one cup of water. Microwave for two minutes or until it is boiling. This will not only eliminate odors, but also makes it very easy to wipe away stuck-on food.

8. Getting rid of cobwebs

To clean cobwebs in hard-to-reach spots, tie a tube sock to the end of a yardstick. This also works for cleaning under the stove and refrigerator.



9. Bathroom tiles

Lemon oil will not only shine dull bathroom tiles, but also help prevent mold and mildew.

10. Toilet bowls

Eliminate the unsightly ring in the toilet by dropping a bubbling denture tablet into the bowl. Let it sit for at least 30 minutes or overnight. A few swishes of a toilet brush will wipe off the stain.


