Great news - there <u>will be</u> a Central National Meet next year! Twin Cities Regional Group #46 has stepped up and submitted a bid to the National Board to host a Meet July 12-16, 2015, at Cragun's Resort and Hotel in Brainerd, Minnesota. This is the same location as the very successful 2000 Central National Meet. Cragun's will again be offering a complete package including hotel room along with daily breakfast and dinner. The 5-day, 4-night package will be at the same price as the 2000 meet!

Brainerd is located in central Minnesota, about 125 miles northwest of the Twin Cities, or about 530 miles from Northern Illinois - not quite as far as Branson. Cragun's is on scenic Gull Lake; the North Woods setting is fantastic.

Registration will be handled by our good friends at Cornerstone. Watch for registration forms and more information, coming soon. If you enjoyed the Meet in Springfield, why not make plans now to get together with a group to enjoy more V-8 fellowship in Minnesota.
