

Midwest Director

New Officers and Directors

I'm honored to report that the Board has elected me to serve as your National President in 2016. I will be joined by Vice President Phill Hall of California and Secretary Bruce Nelson of Minnesota. Joe Reger of Idaho was elected to the Board to replace outgoing Northwest Director and National President Steve Lemmons and Dave Collette of Pennsylvania is replacing outgoing Mid-Atlantic Director Jon Anderson. Joyce Parsons of Texas was re-elected for another term as South Central Director. Congratulations to all. We also thank Rick Claybaugh of Oklahoma for running for the South Central position. We truly appreciate members who step up and demonstrate their interest in the future of the Club.

Newsletter Judge

David Kelley of Pennsylvania has been ably serving the Club for the past few years as judge of the Regional Newsletter Competition. David has asked the Club to seek a replacement. If anyone would like to serve the Club as Newsletter Judge, please contact me.

National Roster of Members

The Board has decided to drop the following sections from the roster, beginning in 2016: Club By Laws, the Judging Manual, Judging Instructions, and the Index of V-8 Times articles. All these items are available on the Club website and will be provided to members upon request. The reduction of pages in the roster will allow a change in the binding process, saving the Club over \$15,000 annually.

Technical Books

Progress continues on the '40 Ford book, the '49-'51 Mercury book, and the Flathead Engine book. The Club hopes that all of those books will be ready to go to the printer in the next year.

National Tours

Congratulations to the Eastern South Dakota Group for their very successful Black Hills of South Dakota National Driving Tour held September 13-18. It was the largest National Tour to date and reports are that everyone had a great time. Watch for coverage soon in the V-8 Times.

The National Tour Program is proving to be a hit! The Board has approved three National Tours for 2016. Western New York RG#3 is hosting "Fording around the Finger Lakes" July 11 – 15; Hi-Country RG#28 is hosting "The Great Southwestern National Driving Tour" September 13-19; and Georgia RG#24 is hosting "The Blue Ridge Parkway Tour" September 18-22. Details and registration forms are available on the <u>National website</u> and will be announced in the V-8 Times.

NOVEMBER 17 MEETING MINUTES

President Scott Gilday called the November meeting to order at 7:37 pm. Scott announced that elections for officers and directors would be held later in the meeting and reminded those assembled that there will be no Membership or Director meeting in the month of December. Scott turned the floor over to Ken Bounds for a membership report and update of national news.

Ken reported that of our 87 members 63 had sent in their regional membership renewals with 24 remaining. Ken encouraged those who have not yet renewed their NIRG membership to get them in and he said that he could take renewals during at the break in the meeting. Ken also indicated that there are spaces available for ads in the Road Chatter as a couple advertisers have chosen not to renew.



In his report on the National Early Ford V-8 Club of America Ken stated that the final board meeting of the year took place Saturday, November 14. Ken highlighted the fact that the national club is doing well financially. He mentioned that the national membership roster will be condensed since some material normally included can be found on the website and the new format will result in a significant savings. Ken further reported that the Board hopes that the 1940 Ford book, the 1949-51 Mercury book, and a two volume set dedicated to the flathead V-8 engine will be ready to go to the printer sometime in 2016.

Ken announced that there is a need for a volunteer to judge the regional newsletters for recognition and inquired if anyone is interested in pursuing that position. Ken further announced that two new national driving tours have been scheduled. The tours will be in addition to the previously announced "Fording around the Finger Lakes" Western New York Tour to be held July 11 – July 15, 2016. The tours recently approved are:

- The Great Southwestern National Driving Tour, September 13-19 starting in Canon City, Colorado and finishing in Monument Valley, Utah. The tour features a visit to the Royal Gorge Bridge and Park, the Gunnison National Park, and the world class Gateway Auto Museum.
- The Blue Ridge Parkway Tour to be held September 18-22 from Ashville, NC to Cherokee, NC. Side trips to Waynesville, Maggie Valley, Bryson City, Chimney Rock, Lake Lure, and more.

Ken said that in the future an effort will be made to avoid overlapping dates in the tours. Also he reiterated that registration forms can be found on the National and our Regional Website for the Finger Lakes National Tour and the two 2016 National Meets; Central National Meet Tulsa, OK. June 12-June 16, 2016 and the Eastern National Meet in Gettysburg, PA., August 8-August 11, 2016. Ken announced the next face to face Board Meeting will be February 16-17, 2016 in Phoenix, AZ.

Next Ken announced the results of the National Director elections: in the one contested director race, Joyce Parsons won over Rick Claybaugh, a member of our regional group, retaining her place as the South Central director. Dave Collette from Pennsylvania was elected Mid-Atlantic director. Steve Lemmons, who had served as president finished his terms and will be leaving the Board. Steve's place on the Board was taken by Joe Reger of Idaho. Ken further announced the new roster of National Officers: Vice President Phill Hall from California, Secretary Bruce Nelson from Minnesota and in a surprise announcement Ken confirmed that he will be taking on another term as Early Ford V-8 Club of America National President after being elected by the board.

Joe Serritella's treasurer's report had not yet made it up from Arizona in time for the meeting but when it

arrived it showed routine expenses of \$224.63 (Road Chatter, meeting place, insurance) and income of \$934.00 from the October 50-50 drawing, annual dues and advertising.

The health and welfare report was given by Phyllis Madrigali. Phyllis let us know that John Judge had received an artificial hip after an earlier procedure had not worked well and was recuperating from surgery. John Slobodnik was present after a bout of ill health and the group was glad to see him back on his feet. Phyllis reported that Jo Ann Stack does not need surgery on her foot after her injury which was good news. Len Vinyard announced that our former member Larry Maas died last Sunday. Len said that Larry was a member of our group some time ago before moving to Colorado. Len said there may be a local memorial for Larry this summer. Ken reported that he had spoken to Alan Wall who has moved to upper Michigan and is settled in there. Alan is still experiencing discomfort after his hip replacement.

Moving to reports on tours Ken reported that the Veterans' Day Luncheon was a success with 24 members attending and with five Ford V-8's out in the lot and one Packard.

- John Scheve announced the upcoming Christmas Luncheon 12:00 noon, Sunday December 6, 2015 at the Bohemian Chrystal Restaurant 639 Blackhawk Dr., Westmont, and urged those interested to get their registration and checks in as 20 more people were needed to fill the minimum required for the reservation.
- Frank Madrigali reminded us of the Annual Installation Dinner to be held Saturday January 16, 2016, at the Rockwood Tap, 3131 Finley Rd., Downers Grove. The cost will be \$35.00 and includes a one-hour open bar for social hour, beginning at 6:00 pm.

The big event of the evening was the election for officers and directors. President Scott Gilday again opened nominations. There were no new nominations for officers or directors and Ken Bounds moved that nominations be closed. Ballots were passed out and the vote results were tallied. The officers for 2016 will be: Scott Gilday, President, Joe Serritella, Treasurer, and John Emmering, Secretary. Elected to the Board were Ron Blum, Ken Bounds, Gary Osborne, Stan Stack, and George Zulas.

After the coffee break an informative tech talk was presented by Scott Gilday on the progress of the restoration of his 1947 Ford Station Wagon and some of the work he has done on it accompanied by photos. Before adjourning the meeting the 50-50 raffle was held, with Joe Novak winning the \$33.00 jackpot. Our annual turkey drawing was next and Stan Stack won two of the turkeys with Dan Pudelek winning a third. With that the last meeting of 2015 was adjourned.

Larry Maas - July 29, 1938 - November 15, 2015

A 1945 Series 59C ½ Ton Pickup becomes the 31 Millionth Ford By John Emmering

As the German war machine was in the process of capitulation in Europe, Ford Motor Company briefly turned its attention to the production of the company's 31 Millionth vehicle on Thursday May 3, 1945. This time the vehicle was not a stylish sedan, since passenger car production had not yet resumed. The 31 Millionth Ford was a Spartan-appearing 1945 series 59C ½ ton pickup truck. Lacking the fanfare of earlier production milestones this event did not garner national press coverage or lavish ceremonies. As the pickup rolled off the Rouge assembly line however, worker's spirits were lifted as the prospect of a return to full peacetime production increased.





The U.S. War Production Board authorized a resumption of civilian pickup truck production in February of 1945 when it perceived a need for trucks for business and agricultural use. Initially a clone of the 1942 Model 29C pick up was produced. By May the trucks had been designated as Series 59C incorporating the modifications prepared for the 1946 models. These early pickups were designated 1945 models and the 59C series was continued throughout 1946. The pickups were the only civilian trucks built by Ford in 1945 and came only in "Village Green" with cream colored grills. Just 564 of these trucks were built in 1945 and they were not equipped with a spare tire due to war time shortages. These early post war trucks were eagerly purchased by businessmen and farmers weary of repairing and maintaining their tired older model pickups.

Holiday Fruitcake Recipe

Wishing you a safe and season save holiday season

1 C Water
1 C Sugar
4 Large eggs
3 C dried fruit
1 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. salt
1 C Brown sugar
Lemon juice, nuts



1 FULL bottle of your favorite whiskey
