Our 1940 Ford Standard Tudor By George Zulas

It all started one fall day in 1994 at the Jefferson Wisconsin Swap Meet. My friend Ken and I walked the swap meet in a Saturday. The weather, as I recall, was nice – it wasn't raining or very cold – so it was a good swap meet weather day.

After the swap meet we looked at the cars for sale; nothing of real interest to me. Ken spotted a black '40 Tudor. He was giving the car the once-over, twice checking the bottom of the doors, deck lid area, etc. He was impressed. Ken has worked at dealerships, hot rod shops, and restoration shops, so I value his eye for cars. This got me to start looking too. I liked what I saw.

On the way home we're talking about the '40. So I told Ken I would like to take the car for a drive. I get home and told Dawn about a nice '40 I'd like to buy. Dawn says "You have a '40 in the garage all apart. Fix it up." But Dawn, you don't understand. She says "Yes I do."

During the next week, Ken calls and they're talking about the car. Ken says "If George doesn't buy it, I will." That statement was all the help I needed. Dawn says "Go call that guy and take a test drive."

I called the owner in Wisconsin and talked to him about the car. I told him I'm very interested in the '40. One weekend leads to another and no test drive. Finally I call him mid-week and ask if I can see the car next weekend. He says "Sure." I call on a Friday to set up a time. I ask if 2:00 or 3:00 pm is OK on Saturday. He tells me someone is looking at the car around 1:00 pm. Man – panic time! I call Ken. Can we get to Jefferson around 10:00 am? I call the owner back and ask if we can see the car at 10:00 am and he says "Sure."

We race up to Jefferson to check out the car and test drive it. I gave him a deposit. We get to his driveway and he tells us to flip the switch – it's for the electric fuel pump. No problem – my old '50 Ford had an electric fuel pump with no problems at all. He has a real long driveway. Don't worry; we can make it to the garage without running out of gas.

We listen to the motor. No knocks or strange noises at all. Gauges all work; some smoke out the tailpipe (normal I guess). After we get the car home and drive it around, it used some oil. No big thing.

Our first big trip with the '40 was to Indiana for the covered bridge festival. We get on the highway and stop to get gas. Well, let's check the oil. Nothing shows up on the dipstick. I go in and get a quart of 30-weight oil. Pour it in. Nothing on the dipstick. I get another quart. Still nothing on the dipstick. I put in a total of three quarts. Looks like a problem to me. So I buy two extra quarts for the road – this should be good enough.

Well, we're driving along and guess what? We have to make a pit stop for you-know-who! So I check the oil – nothing on the dipstick. This goes on for the whole trip. We finally make it home to Westmont after

putting in 42 quarts of oil. Yes, you read that correct. Forty-two quarts of oil.

Remember the prior owner saying to flip that switch to turn off the electric fuel pump at the beginning of

his long drive? That caused the cylinders to be washed down with fuel. While looking at the engine I noticed that the fuel line went right to the carb and not to the stock fuel pump. I corrected this but it was too late for the engine. The electric fuel pump had too much pressure and overcame the pressure on the float seat. I started to use 60-weight racing oil and a couple cans of STP – this helped some.

We started to drive the car to local car shows, then not at all because of the exhaust pipe smoke. Also, the hot air heat exchanger rusted through; this was bearable for local shows or short trips - with the cowl vent open we could breathe. The last straw was taking the car to Lloyd Duzell's funeral. We were nearly gassed out on this trip. Westmont to Arlington Heights and back was the last trip we made. This car needs a new engine.

My son George and I worked on another engine I had in the garage, a 59A. This engine sat for about 10-12 years uncovered, so George took it apart and washed everything in the parts washer. We had machine work done at Built-Right by Bill. I dug out old aluminum heads I had for years and had to have some welding done in the combustion chambers.

Now our Central National Meet is getting close and Dawn says, with a tear in her eye, I want to go in the '40, not our new car. Two weeks before the meet the old motor is out and the new motor is getting buttoned up.

Dawn kept looking at our progress. It's not going to be done in time is it? I'll get it done. "Yeah, right" she says.

Everything got done one week before the meet. I've got a stockpile of old parts from years of swap meets. I got the old 97 carburetor out of the Sears Allstate box (rebuilt by Sears). Same thing for the two -bolt distributor; filed the points, new condenser, and put on a crab distributor cap. I got to use other stuff after maybe 40 years of owning it.

Let's fire it up! We get gas, hook up water, get a battery, put on tube headers with extensions. She fires right up. We rev the Hell out if it – also has a Weber cam. So sweet. Who comes up the drive? One of Roselle's finest. We shut it down. He looks at the '40, no motor, and says "You have to test the motor before you put it in the car." Thank you – another gearhead. He says, "Oh, by the way we had a noise complaint from a neighbor; this isn't that loud" and walks away.

Everything was done one week before the Meet. Motor in, exhaust done, brakes adjusted, clutch adjusted. We start to drive

JANUARY 20 MEETING MINUTES

President Scott Gilday called the meeting to order at 7:52 pm. Scott introduced Terry Freihage's daughter Michelle, who planned to address the membership later in the meeting about possibilities of a car show in Palatine.

With Membership Chairman and Midwest Director Ken Bounds away on a Caribbean vacation Scott announced the membership and national club reports would be deferred until Ken returns next month. Scott did mention that the National Board meeting would be held in February.

Treasurer Joe Serritella was once again in Arizona on a winter retreat, so in his absence Scott gave the Treasurer's report, announcing income for December 2014 of \$8,535.12, expenses of \$2,745.75 and an ending balance of \$18,269.

Health & Welfare Chairman Phyllis Madrigali reported that she had not received any calls from members with concerns and asked if the membership had any knowledge of situations they could share with the group. Dan Pudelek reminded those assembled of the injury that Judy Buscaglia suffered December 7 at the Annual Christmas Luncheon when she fell and broke her ankle in three places. Dan added that the doctors are exploring treatment options to help her get back on her feet.

President Gilday presented Charlie Kaiser with a service award for sponsoring his annual Pioneer Turners Luncheon last March. Charlie used the opportunity to announce that the event will be held again this year at 1:00 pm on Saturday March 7, at the Café Prague, 6710 W. Belmont Chicago. Look for more information on the event in the Road Chatter.

Scott Gilday then brought up the subject of tours and activities noting that the club still is in need of someone to serve as tour director. Scott reviewed some of last years' activities giving John Scheve the floor for a short report on the success of the December 2014 Christmas Luncheon. Frank Madrigali then gave a very positive report on the event he and Phyllis sponsored, the Annual Installation Dinner held on January 10. Scott mentioned this year's plans for a Pizza meeting April 21, an Eggs & Eights breakfast in April and proposed a safety check event at Roundhead's in Lombard in the spring. The idea of a Valentine's Theater or lunch event was also proposed.

Scott interrupted his report and gave the floor to Michelle Freihage to present the proposed idea of the NIRG participating in a car show hosted by the Palatine Jaycees at their 58th Annual Home Town Fest on July 5, 2015. There was group discussion of the proposal and some misgivings about displaying our V-8's at a carnival setting where alcoholic beverages would be served and there would be a possibility of unsupervised children. Michelle appreciated the concerns and suggested the car show could be held in conjunction with Palatine's "Art Around the Square" event on the weekend of Sept. 12-13, 2015. John Slobodnik suggested that Michelle return next month with more details.

Joe Dispensa took the floor to explain developments in his planned Veterans' Car Show scheduled for Sunday August 23, 2015 on LaSalle St. in Aurora. Joe explained that the event would partner with the Aurora Chapter of the American Legion and all proceeds would be administered by the American Legion Chapter to meet needs of area veterans through special assistance aimed at their individual challenges. Joe added that the USO would be conducting a 50-50 raffle to support that non-profit group, which provides entertainment and services to military personnel. Joe said that participants in his Veteran's Car Show could take part in offering short rides to veterans in their collector cars or show them in the regular display. Joe added that antique military vehicles were wanted and that the event would feature a helicopter and also have a Veteran's Motorcycle Club participating.

JANUARY 20 MEETING MINUTES - CONTINUED

Joe further explained that on Saturday, September 12, 2015 he will be sponsoring a tour to Hines Hospital to display our vehicles to the disabled veterans and patients. Joe said that a maximum of 23 cars could participate due to space limitations at the facility. Joe passed around sign-up sheets for his events and explained that although he will be gone until April the sign-up sheets will continue to circulate at meetings.

Some future events were announced by Tom O'Donnell as he took the floor. Tom explained the details of the joint tour with the Northern Ohio group scheduled for July 30 - August 2, 2015. Departing from Lincoln Oasis 9:00 am Thursday July 30 and returning from Ohio after breakfast Sunday, August 2. There will be a more detailed announcement to come in the Road Chatter. Tom also encouraged the membership to participate in Motorfest 6 in Auburn, Indiana hosted by the Early Ford V-8 Foundation & Museum, August 26-29. The Motorfest will include tours to Ft. Wayne, a Historical Railroad Society excursion, a side trip to the Air Zoo Museum in Kalamazoo, a banquet, and a car show around the Auburn town square. See www.fordv8foundation.org for all details.

Scott and Tom further discussed the Central National Meet in Brainerd, MN. Several members indicated a desire to attend the Central National Meet. Tom O'Donnell said the NIRG participants will leave Saturday July 11, stop overnight and arrive around noon Sunday July 12. Departure will be Thursday July 16 after the luncheon with an overnight stay in Wisconsin and arrival back home Friday July 17th.

After a short coffee and cookie break Scott Gilday led a question and answer session opening the floor to a discussion of various aspects of V-8 restoration and repair. After the technical discussion tickets were drawn for the 50-50 and Tom O'Donnell received a windfall of \$14.00 as winner of the raffle. The meeting was adjourned at 9:21 by President Scott Gilday.

Valentine's Popcorn (White Chocolate Popcorn)

Place the popcorn in a large bowl, and pour the melted chocolate over it. Then use a spoon to toss the popcorn gently until it is evenly coated with the chocolate. Spread the popcorn out evenly on a baking sheet covered with parchment, wax paper, or aluminum foil.
