
Fire Up Your Early V-8 and Join Your Friends "Duals Night" at Culver's

Our Tour to the Illinois Veterans' Home – Manteno, Illinois By Ken Bounds

After a week of bright sunshine and temperatures in the 80s, we welcomed the prediction of cooler temperatures that would allow the veterans to stay outside a little longer to view our cars. Unfortunately, the predictions were overly optimistic. By the morning of May 31, we awoke to temperatures in the 40s, overcast skies, and even a little unpredicted mist. Sadly, the high temperature for the day at our destination, the Illinois Veterans' Home in Manteno, IL, was barely in the 50s.

The unexpectedly chilly, damp weather did not dissuade several hardy V-8ers from bringing out their gorgeous Early V-8s for our first spring driving tour to display our cars to some American heroes. Meeting early in the morning at White Fence Farm in Romeoville were: Ron Blum - '40 Ford Fordor, Ken Bounds - '50 Ford Convertible, Tom & Judy Buscaglia - '51 Ford Tudor, John Emmering - '49 Ford Fordor, Frank Koeder - '39 Ford Standard Tudor, Kathy Larson - modern, Joey Novak & Millie Olds - '53 Mercury Hardtop, Roger Obecny - '40 Ford Tudor, Tom O'Donnell - '53 Lincoln Sport Coupe, John Slobodnik - '54 Ford Fordor, Stan Stack with nephew Steve - '53 Ford Tudor, and Ron Steck – modern. Just after 8:30 am our little caravan headed out toward Manteno. Jim Larson had that pesky work thing and his '39 Tudor is not quite ready to go, but his wife Kathy was able to participate and rode along with me. It was chilly, but dry, as we made our way over secondary roads, bypassing most congested areas. After a pleasant one-hour drive, we arrived at the Veterans' Home and drove up the flag-lined entrance road where we were greeted by Sam Van Bruggen who had arrived just before us in his '41 Pickup.

We parked in the grass along a curved sidewalk where the veterans, mostly wheel-chair bound, were able to get a close look at our vehicles. We gave each veteran that we encountered an American flag pin and thanked them for their service. The temperatures didn't cooperate much and the wind aggravated the chill, but that didn't stop quite of few of the men and women who live in the home from admiring our cars, even if only for a short time.

While some of our members stayed outside greeting the veterans, looking at the cars, and evaluating Frank's new find as well as Sam's pickup, others sought refuge from the cold wind inside. It really was rewarding talking with the veterans about our cars and we hope they brought back memories for most of them. After what seemed like an all-too-short stay, it was time to leave. Around 11:15 we began our drive back to the White Fence Farm,

His informative presentation told us how these gasoline-powered behemoths ruled the plains only a few short years until Henry Ford revolutionized farming with his much smaller, less expensive, easily repairable Fordson tractor.

Both touring groups met for a delicious buffet lunch in McPherson, KS, before we split again and headed to our second stop. We were treated to an incredible

tour of the Automotive Restoration Program at McPherson College. This is the only known 4-year bachelor's program in auto restoration technology. One of the instructors showed and explained to us the various "shops" in the program, including the paint shop, the engine shop, the interior and top shop, the metal fabrication shop, the wood shop, a foundry, and much more. Our final stop was the fully restored McPherson Opera House built 1888-1889. What a terrific old building. Our tour guide was knowledgeable and interesting. The building is being used for many events and meetings and looks better than ever.

MAY 19 MEETING MINUTES

Our May meeting opened at 7:47 pm when President Scott Gilday called the meeting to order. Scott introduced a first time visitor, Martin Cobb from Northbrook. Martin shared with the group that he has an appreciation for flathead Fords and currently owns a classic hotrod described as a Model "A" body sitting on a 1932 Ford frame powered by a Mercury flathead engine. Paul Levine introduced his guest Mike Maslowski, Regional Territory Manager for Hagerty Insurance, who was on hand to give a tech talk on collector car insurance later in the meeting.

Membership Chairman Ken Bounds reported that membership remains at 85 this month. Ken then went into his update on national Early Ford V-8 Club of America news, beginning with a report on the meeting held by telephone on Saturday May 16. Ken said that the club's new legal advisor was present. Ken thought the highlight of the meeting was the treasurer's report which revealed that after the recent audit the auditors gave an "unqualified opinion" that the financial records were accurate and in order. Further The 1949-51 Mercury Book and The Flathead V-8 Book are making progress and should be ready for printing next year. Also the club has begun successfully selling books on Amazon. Ken added that on the web a new national club Facebook page is up and being maintained and the national website is being made mobile device friendly.

Ken concluded his remarks with a summary of upcoming national events, including the Eastern National Meet June 8-11 in Concord, NC, and Central National Meet in Brainerd, MN July 12-16. Seven members indicated they would be going to Brainerd by a show of hands and about four cars from our regional group are set to participate. Ken can give information on the group drive to the Brainerd Meet and he has a packet of information for anyone planning to attend. Ken also made mention of the Black Hills National Driving Tour Sept. 13-19, and announced that plans are being made for a 2016 Central National Meet in Tulsa, OK.

Joe Serritella was back from Arizona and delivered his treasurer's report. Joe reported income of \$41 from the 50/50 raffle and \$15 received for dues. Expenses consisted of normal Road Chatter expense and meeting room rent. Also a \$100 memorial gift was sent in honor of Jerry Webb and \$288 had been expended to support the Pizza Meeting and Night at the Races activities.

Phyllis Madrigali did not have any health and welfare needs to share, however Joe Serritella shared an account of the miraculous progress his daughter Kathey has made from cancer.

Our tech talk for the evening involved Collector Car insurance available from Hagerty Insurance. Our own Paul Levine began the talk explaining some of Hagerty's criteria for a collector car to receive coverage, being that the car is at least 25 years old and not used for daily transportation. Paul explained that there is liberal vehicle use policy. Mike Maslowski continued the talk explaining the importance of the agreed value of the car being guaranteed by Hagerty. Mike explained the company's coverage for vehicles under restoration, their concierge service for assisting clients with finding parts and the trip interruption coverage for those delayed en route to a meet. As the coffee break was called, members were able to chat with and get more information from Paul and Mike.

After the break the tour reports began and Ken Bounds started the reports with information about the tour he is sponsoring to the Illinois Veterans' home in Manteno, IL on Sunday May 31. Ken passed around a sign-up sheet once again and shared the details. Ken again invited participation in the Joint Tour to Dayton, Ohio with the Northern Ohio Regional Group July 30-August 2, and gave members the opportunity to sign up. Ken emphasized that the deadline to make hotel reservations is July 8. Ken added

The first event Joe described is the 7th Annual Historic LaSalle Street Auto Show Auto Row show which will be held Sunday August 23. This year the Aurora American Legion Post will be involved and the theme will be "Honoring our Local Veterans" Joe circulated a sign-up sheet for those who plan to enter a car and those who would be willing to provide short demonstration rides for veterans. This time of year the fruit and produce are looking so fresh at the grocery store. You want to wash the winter blues away with blueberries, raspberries, grapes and strawberries. Oh Strawberries! Even our cat goes nuts for them. Here are 14 things you might not know about strawberries.

14 Things you Didn't Know about Strawberries

- 1. **Strawberries are the only fruit that wear their seeds on the outside**. The average berry is adorned with some 200 of them. No wonder it only takes one bite to get seeds stuck in your teeth.
- 2. **Strawberries aren't true berries, like blueberries or even grapes**. Technically, a berry has its seeds on the inside. And, to be über technical, each seed on a strawberry is considered by botanists to be its own separate fruit.
- 3. **Strawberries are members of the rose family**. Should you come upon a bush of them growing, you'll see: they smell as sweet as they taste.
- 4. **The strawberry plant is a perennial**. This means if you plant one now, it will come back next year and the following and the year after that. It may not bear fruit immediately, but once it does, it will remain productive for about five years.
- 5. Americans eat an average of three-and-a-half pounds of fresh strawberries each per year. It's closer to five pounds if you count frozen ones. In a study, more than half of nine-year-olds picked strawberries as their favorite fruit. They're nature's candy!
- 6. **Belgium has a museum dedicated to strawberries**. In the gift shop at Le Musée de la Fraise (The Strawberry Museum), you can buy everything from strawberry jam to strawberry beer.
- 7. **Native Americans ate strawberries long before European settlers arrived**. As spring's first fruit, they were a treat, eaten freshly picked or baked into cornbread.
- 8. **The ancient Romans thought strawberries had medicinal powers**. They used them to treat everything from depression to fainting to fever, kidney stones, bad breath and sore throats.
- 9. **Sex & Strawberries?** In France, where they're believed to be an aphrodisiac, strawberries are served to newlyweds at traditional wedding breakfasts in the form of a creamy sweet soup.
- 10. Strawberries are believed to help reduce the risk of heart disease and certain cancers. They are low in calories and high in vitamins C, B6, K, fiber, folic acid, potassium and amino acids.
- 11. **Strawberries contain high levels of nitrate**. This has been shown to increase blood and oxygen flow to the muscles. Research suggests that people who load up on strawberries before exercising have greater endurance and burn more calories.
- 12. California produces some 80% of the strawberries in the U.S. They grow about 2 billion pounds of the heart-shaped fruits per year. Every state in the U.S. and every province in Canada grows their own.
- 13. To store fresh strawberries, wash them and cut the stem away. However, if you plan to keep them in the fridge for a few days, wait until before you eat them to clean them. Rinsing them speeds up spoiling.
- 14. **Strawberries can also be pickled.** Especially when picked green or unripe. If your berries are overripe, make jam!


