

APRIL 19 MEETING MINUTES - CONTINUED

NATIONAL CLUB NEWS: Ken Bounds, National President of the early Ford V-8 Club of America offered his report of national activities. Ken announced that the March/April V-8 Times and Roster are out and should have arrived. The Membership Roster came out in a slightly condensed form eliminating some information that is available on the National website and saving \$15,000 in costs. The new version of the National Club website was posted on April 2 and most members' impressions of the new format have been positive.

Ken announced that one candidate from Iowa has submitted paperwork to run for Director of the Central Region and our own Jeff Trilling is planning to submit his resume for the position. On the subject of National Meets, Ken reported that at least eight of our members have signed up to go to the Central National Meet in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Everyone going to Tulsa should have received a route plan for the drive. The group will depart on Saturday June 11 for Tulsa driving over two days with a stop in Lebanon, Missouri.

Ken announced that the 2017 Eastern National Meet will be held in June 7-11, 2017 at Chantilly, Virginia. Ken further discussed the plans for the Western National Meet in Bakersfield, California October 17-20, 2016. The meet will be sponsored by the national club board of directors. So far 95 participants have registered.

2017 CENTRAL NATIONAL MEET: Discussion was held on the feasibility of our Regional Group sponsoring a 2017 Central National Meet in Springfield, Illinois. Members voted on whether they thought holding another meet in Springfield was a good idea regardless if they felt they could work the meet or not. Final vote was 28 in favor of holding another Central National Meet in Springfield with three opposed. After the vote Ken Bounds said he would check with the venue in Springfield for availability and pricing.

At 8:40 pm we broke the meeting for our coffee and cookie break. We reconvened and Jeff Trilling gave a two-part presentation. The first part was on the lubrication of the fan pulley on Ford trucks of the era of Jeff's 1952 Pickup and Ford cars of the '40s. The second half of Jeff's presentation featured a photographic tour of the collection of the late Lee Roy Hartung which he kept in Glenview. There were many interesting rare old automobiles, bicycles, and motorcycles in the collection.

Our visitor Ron Ek had the honor of drawing the 50-50 ticket and Frank Koeder came up the lucky winner with the \$38.00 jackpot.
