Of course, I took it up to Union Grove dragstrip after I put on lakes pipes and ran several times over the next few years.

NATIONAL CLUB NEWS: Ken, the National President of the Early Ford V-8 Club of America, went into his report on national club news. Ken recounted that the Eastern National Meet in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, was a success. Ken also reminded us that the Western National Meet is coming up October 17-20 and will be held in Bakersfield, California. Ken also mentioned the two National Ford V-8 driving tours that are coming up soon. September 13-19 the Great Southwestern Driving Tour will take place in Colorado, and the Blue Ridge Parkway National Tour will be held September 18-22 in North Carolina. Ken mentioned some of the events planned for next year, including the 2017 Eastern National Meet sponsored by the Northern Virginia Regional Group June 7-11, 2017, in Chantilly, Virginia. Ken mentioned that registration forms can be found on our NIRG website at this time. Ken Bounds gave a report on the Eastern National Meet. Ken reported that he and Carolyn drove their 1950 Ford Custom Convertible accompanied by Joe Novak and Millie Olds in Joe's 1953 Mercury Monterey and Joe and Delice Serritella in modern. 




