## Tell it to the Judge

Who can forget that classic 1949 romantic comedy, *Tell It to the Judge*, starring Rosalind Russell (the judge) as a divorcee who tries to get back her ex-husband, played by Robert Cummings? Apparently most can; has anyone ever heard of it?

On February 1, I was honored and excited to begin my first term as National Chief Judge of the Early Ford V-8 Club. Thanks go out to John McBurney for his years of service in that position.

Over the coming months, I want to encourage our members to understand more about the Club's vehicle classification and judging system and to also encourage more of you to consider becoming a judge. The upcoming Grand National Meet is an excellent op-

portunity to serve as a novice judge if you have never judged at a V-8 Meet, or for you veterans to take another turn.

If you have never considered signing up to be a judge at a national meet because you don't know how the system works, or you don't know enough about the cars being judged, you probably know more than you think. In the Early Ford V-8 Club, vehicles are judged against a set of standards - not against each other. Those standards are clearly laid out on a series of judging sheets and judging standards.

When the weather gets warmer (a lot warmer) we plan to schedule a "judging seminar." The intent is to get together, probably on a Saturday, and go over the ins and outs of the judging process. You will receive a set of the judging standards and the judging forms so you can understand such things as "standard point deductions," "authenticity, condition, and fit," and more. After the "lecture" portion of the seminar, we will move on to actual vehicles that have been subjected to judging to practically apply the principles learned. Watch the Road Chatter for scheduling and location. I encourage everyone attending the Grand National Meet and anyone else interested in the judging process to attend.

Over the next few issues I want to start talking about the Divisions in which you can enter your vehicle at Early Ford V-8 Club meets. Overall, we have point-judged, original, and touring divisions at each meet, along with a display class.

This month we introduce the point-judged divisions. These divisions are intended for vehicles that are as close to possible to the appearance and condition they were when they left the Ford factory or the dealership. These can be original vehicles that are still in outstanding condition or may be vehicles that have been fully restored to factory specifications. The restoration need not be a multi-thousand dollar professional restoration - many members restore them themselves. Fortunately, for most vehicles the Early Ford V-8 Club has an outstanding library of books to help the restorer.

Following is a <u>very brief</u> description of the point judged divisions of the Early Ford V-8 Club.

<u>Concourse Division</u>: The first time a vehicle is entered by its current owner to be point judged, it is placed in Concourse Division. If it receives at least 950 points out of 1,000, it receives a Dearborn award and graduates to Dearborn Division. If it does not receive 950 points, items can be corrected and the vehicle returns to Concourse Division at the next meet where it is entered.

<u>Dearborn Division</u>: A vehicle to be point judged that has previously received the Dearborn award with its current owner. If it receives at least 925 points, it is awarded a V-8 Medallion award and a Dearborn Award License Tab. Vehicles sporting this license tab at a subsequent meet may be selected for "walk-around" judging at the discretion of the National Chief Judge.

<u>Dearborn Emeritus Division</u>: A vehicle which has received a Dearborn Medallion and at least one walkaround can be placed in the Dearborn Emeritus Division and is eligible for the Emeritus Medallion. It will be briefly judged to ensure is substantially meets concourse standards.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 PM.


