June 1-5 - Eastern National Meet, Franklin, Tennessee.


June 18 - National Drive Your Early V-8 Day - tour to Yockeyville, club member Randy Yockey's museum in Campton Hills.



MARCH 15 MEETING MINUTES

Breaking News - Ford Motor Company Discovers Long-Lost Vehicle Build Records!

How many of us have had the dream to be able to research details of our vehicle as it was built based on the serial number? For collectors of many classic car marques, this information has always been available to them. But, sadly, not for our Early Ford V-8 vehicles. **Until now!** Read on.

Records of this type were long ago declared lost by the Ford Motor Company; many believe in the infamous Rotunda fire in November 1962. But nearly six decades later, the story takes an interesting turn. With the Benson Ford Research Center being virtually shuttered due to the COVID-19 pandemic, workers there decided to use down time to do some cleaning and rearranging. Much to their surprise, in a long-forgotten store room, the workers found a large group of uncatalogued boxes simply marked "From the Rotunda." These boxes went ignored for several more months until the workers recently decided to investigate the contents. What they found were trays and trays of microfiche records. Now to find a working microfiche reader. But when they did, the BFRC employees could not believe their own eyes! They were looking at the long-believed-lost build records!

These records were like finding the golden fleece - the Rosetta Stone for Early Ford V-8 collectors and restorers. The build records for each "flathead era" serial number are said to include:

- the model year, make, assembly plant, and date of assembly
- the body style and body manufacturer if other than Ford
- the exterior colors, wheel colors, and interior fabrics (color and type)
- the installed engine type and horsepower
- a description of installed accessories
- in some cases, the destination dealership and in rare cases, the name and address of the original purchaser!

These records will be a gold mine for Early Ford V-8 restorers. Unfortunately the BFRC and Ford are going to make the records available for one day only - today, April 1. Then they will be destroyed because of lack of storage space.

(Sorry - April 1 - this just seems too cruel).

40 Years Ago This Month – April 1982

A crowd of 69 attended the 3rd Annual Pizza Meeting April 13. New member Barry Jacksier (who was the original Chairman of the 1986 Central National Meet) was welcomed. Seventeen members and family participated in an April 25 Tour in Time in Rockford, hosted by Chuck & Diane Wrobel. The tour included stops at the Time Museum at the Clock Tower Inn and the Rockford Museum-Midway Village.

50 Years Ago This Month – April 1972

The March newsletter welcomed new member George Cech, along with his '36 Phaeton. The newsletter

published its second story about a member's car, Bob Blackmore's '41 Convertible (41-48 Fords had just been accepted into the V-8 Club). Plans were being made for a large Club turnout at the May AACA Grayslake meet.

In Memoriam – Earl Heintz By Ken Bounds

We were all surprised and saddened by the sudden passing of Life Member Earl Heintz on March 13. Many NIRG members attended a celebration of Earl's life on March 15; I was honored to speak for the Club at the ceremony.

Earl was a well-respected and valued member of our group. He and his wife Gene joined the club in 1974 and were very active right from the start. Over the years they participated in countless group events and attended several National Meets. Earl served as our Vice President in 1979 and for 16 years as club Treasurer – first from 1983-1993 and again from 2000-2004. One of Earl's most lasting contributions to the club occurred in 1982 when we were in search of a new location to hold our meetings. Earl identified the ideal place – The Wheeling Township Service Center – where we still hold monthly meetings to this day nearly 39 years later.

Earl owned a business called Arlington Tile. His company installed tile in commercial buildings such as shopping centers and downtown high rises. One story that I enjoy and shared at the remembrance is about the original ceramic tile floors at Stratford Mall shopping center in Bloomingdale. Most people didn't ever notice, but if you stood on the second floor, near the elevator, and looked down at the first floor, you could make out Earl and his partner's initials cleverly hidden in the design.

There are many stories of Earl and Gene's participation in tours, such as the infamous accident involving their 1951 Mercury during a driving tour to the Quad Cities in 1982. But the event that most of us "old timers" remember best was our annual tour to the Lake Geneva Classic Car Rally. Earl and Gene were terrific hosts many years at their cottage on Lake Como. Sometimes we went out to dinner, but always after a gathering with cocktails and hors d'oeuvre at the cottage. More often they rolled out a dinner spread that could feed an army. We will always cherish those times.

A final story that I wanted to share showed to me just what kind of a man Earl was. In late fall 2012 he called and told me that he was ready to sell his beloved 1951 Mercury. I told Earl that we were definitely interested and wanted to go to his home and see the car. Earl said "No. The weather is starting to get bad and it is not leaving the garage until Spring. I'm not going to let you buy the car without a test drive, so this will have to wait." When spring finally arrived, Carolyn and I went, took a test drive, and offered to pay for the car on the spot. Earl asked "You mean you want to take it to-day? I haven't even had a chance to take it for its annual oil change and grease job." That was Earl.

Earl said they always called the car their anniversary car since they were married in 1951. We just call her Genevieve.


