## V-8 Gals

For a dozen years from 2007 to 2018, the Road Chatter hailed August as "cocktail month," presenting a refreshing cocktail idea to spice up the dog days of summer.

This year, the V-8 Gals return to that tradition! Since many of our members have joined since August of 2017, we decided to reprint a member favorite - which also just happens to be the first one in the series - the *Julia Belle Swain*. This cocktail was enjoyed by many Early Ford V-8 Club members on a cruise during the 2007 Central National Meet, referenced in the recipe. Interestingly, an excursion on the *Julia Belle Swain* also happened during the 1975 Central National Meet in Peoria.

Sadly, soon after the 2007 meet, the steam paddle-wheeler was shut down due to the recession. In 2013, a foundation was formed to purchase the ship and an extensive restoration began. So far over \$2.6 million has been invested. The ship, shown in its glory days on the next page, is currently for sale.

As you read in Ken's write-up of the Central National Meet in Winona, one of the highlights was a trip on the *Julia Belle Swain* riverboat. That trip was tons of fun. In addition to the good food and scenery, the fantastic staff served a delightful drink called the *Julia Belle Swain*. After a couple of sips, I had to know what was in it. There were several ladies from our group enjoying this drink. Our waitress was more than happy to provide the list of ingredients.

When we arrived home I hit the grocery store armed with the list of ingredients, determined to recreate that drink. I knew what was in it but didn't know how much of this and that went in to the drink. This called for some experimenting. While chemistry experiments in high school were not my thing, this was something I could do. A bottle of rum later and many delicious attempts, I believe I have the correct proportions. The following is for a 10 - 12 oz glass. Feel free to do your own experimenting.

- 1 1/2 2 shots coconut rum (like Malibu Coconut Rum)
- A splash of grenadine for color
- 1/2 cup of orange juice
- A double splash of cream (we used Half & Half and it was just as good)
- Just a quick stir. Serve with ice and garnish with a cherry.
