JANUARY 18 MEETING MINUTES

Our returning President (for a 4th year!) Ron Steck gaveled the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Since our Installation Dinner had to be cancelled, the first order of business was to swear in the new slate of officers. Retiring Director John Emmering did the honors, leading the group in the *So Help Me Henry* pledge. The new officers sworn in were President Ron Steck, Secretary Ken Bounds, Treasurer Ron Blum, Membership Chairman Ken Bounds, Health & Welfare Chair Phyllis Madrigali, Tour Chairmen Pat Maroney and Gary Osborne, and Board of Directors Scott Gilday, Pat Maroney, and Tom O'Donnell. Vice President Dan Pudelek and Directors Jay Hinshaw and Este Scheve were not present.



New Secretary Ken Bounds presented a brief summary from the January board meeting. All Board meetings are now being held via Zoom. The Board made the decision to cancel the Installation Dinner because of the Omicron surge and spent some time setting up the calendar of events for the year. We also discussed the demise of website hosting by Hemming's Motor News and the establishment of a new arrangement for hosting the NIRG website. The Board thanks Hemming's for their support of car clubs for many years.

Membership Chair Ken Bounds (again?) presented the status of membership renewals, noting that we currently have 77 members, of whom 52 have paid their dues. Anyone not paying dues by the end of the month will not be included in the Annual Roster, expected to be available at the February meeting.

Ken talked about changes this year to the Road Chatter and thanked John Emmering for doing a great job as editor for the past 3-plus years. The Board agreed that if the Road Chatter was to continue, it would be reduced in size and issued only via e-mail, except for about 10 members who do not use e-mail. Ken and Carolyn Bounds have resumed the job of Road Chatter editors. No problems were voiced about the transition to the new format and delivery.

Ken also presented an update of national club news, primarily the status of the National Meets and Driving Tours. Registration for the Eastern meet in Tennessee is up to 131, including 11 from our group. Full registration packets went out to all early registrations on Sunday, January 16. <u>Registration</u> for the Western meet is expected to begin around February 1. Registration for the National Driving Tours should also be available soon. There was quite a bit of interest shown in the Wisconsin tour being hosted by the Twin Cities regional group.

Treasurer Ron Blum gave his report showing the club to be in good financial shape.

Health and Welfare Chairman Phyllis Madrigali said she had nothing significant to report. A reminder, if you hear of any issues with our members or their families please notify Phyllis. Ken reported that Dan Pudelek had a medical situation New Years Eve that required hospitalization for a week. Dan is home now and is recovering.

Past Events:

• Scott Gilday reported on the Christmas Luncheon that he and Nicole hosted December 18th at Makray Country Club in Barrington. Scott said that the event went very well and that the 19 members who attended had a good time.

Future Events:

• Ron discussed the various events that have been added to the calendar. Coming up too soon to be published in the Road Chatter are two winter events in coming weekends, a snow sculpture event in Rockford (discussed by Tom O'Donnell) and an ice sculpture event in downtown Lake Geneva. A show of hands did not indicate a lot of interest in attending as a club.

Chicken Puffs

Ingredients:

- 3 oz cream cheese, softened
- 1 TBSP butter or margarine
- 2 cups cubed cooked chicken
- 1 TBSP chopped chives or onions
- ¹/₄ tsp salt, or to taste
- ¹/₈ tsp pepper, or to taste
- 2 TSBP milk
- 1-8oz can refrigerated crescent rolls

Directions:

- Heat oven to 350°
- In medium bowl, beat cream cheese & 1 TBSP softened butter 'til smooth.
- Add chicken, chives, salt & pepper. Mix well.
- Separate dough into 4 rectangles. Press perforations to seal.
- Spoon ¹/₂ cup of chicken mixture onto center of each rectangle.
- Pull 4 corners of dough to center of chicken mixture, twist firmly; pinch edges to seal. Place on ungreased cookie sheet, brush tops of puffs with 1 TBSP melted butter. Bake at 350° for 25-30 minutes or 'til golden brown.

I make a gravy from a can of cream of chicken soup, a little sauteed chopped onion (in butter) and $\frac{1}{2}$ can of milk.

TECH CORNER

It Worked for Me By Ken Bounds

For those of us who like to keep our Early V-8s close to stock and still rely on 6-volt power, there is always the problem of how to install and run 12-volt accessories, such as CB radios, stereos or even a cell phone charger. In the past I have used a couple of different power inverters. These always had drawbacks, such as finding a place to mount them, unreliability, or the introduction of electrical noise into the radio. They were also easy to burn out if the radio drew too many amps. For the past several years after the old inverters became harder to find, I ran 12-volt batteries in the trunks of the '50 Convertible and Crestliner, but you get tired of manually charging them and never know if they will last the entire trip.

Besides, they take up valuable space that could be used for something else. \bigcirc

While all this was going on, someone sneaked up behind me with new technology. No, it's not a brand-new 6-volt CB (maybe the Easter Bunny will bring one of those). The new technology I'm referring to is an ultracompact 6-volt positive ground to 12-volt negative ground power inverter. The unit I purchased is a tiny $1\frac{3}{4}$ " cube. These little guys are so small that you can easily mount them under the dash, or possibly even on the case of the unit that you intend to power.

Installation could not have been simpler and took less than 10 minutes. On the '50 Convertible, there is a nice little bracket for the heater controls that happens to be well grounded. I was able to mount the inverter completely out of sight on the top of the bracket. There are only two wires for the in-



verter – a fused input from the six-volt side, which I attached the accessory side of the ignition switch, and a 12-volt output, which I fed to the CB power cable. There is also a little grounding pigtail that you can use if you don't mount the inverter directly to a grounded surface. Because the inverter and the 12-volt accessory share a common ground, you don't have to worry about isolating the accessory from the vehicle ground. Since my CB has a ground wire on the power cord, I simply attached it to the same screw that I used to mount the inverter.

I have used the new inverter on the past two tours with no evidence of a problem. The heat from the unit in operation is negligible. You should be aware of the power requirements of the accessories you wish to operate – this inverter can supply about 2.1 amps or about $26\frac{1}{2}$ watts with the engine off – slightly more with the engine running. I'm so impressed that I'm about to buy two more for the Crestliner and the Roadster.

Now for even better news: the price is quite reasonable. These units are available from a number of suppliers, ranging anywhere from \$59 to \$99. I have seen them at Macs and at C&G Auto parts. They might be shown as being from two different manufacturers, Custom Autosound or Antique Automobile Radio. The part number is PGPI-HC. For those of you not afraid to buy on eBay, there is a distributor named Woody's Custom Shop that sells the inverter on eBay for \$59 with <u>free</u> Priority Mail shipping. The owner's name is Charles Rollins. He is a Porsche guy, but otherwise harmless. My inverter arrived in just two days. With the low price and ease of installation, this has really become a "no-brainer". Maybe that is why "It worked for me!"

TECH CORNER UPDATE



January's Tech Corner was about installing a backup camera on an Early V-8, connected via Bluetooth to a GPS. Since the GPS is plugged in to the cigar lighter, how do you get 12 volts? The answer is that I always disconnect the 6-volt vehicle wiring to the cigar lighter, then attach the 12-volt output wire from the little inverter, providing 12 volts to plug in any accessory.

Since this article was written, I have installed these inverters for all my Early V-8s. Even the one installed 16 years ago is still working fine. The e-Bay seller that I mentioned in the article is still selling these units and the price is the same \$59, but he has started charging for shipping. You can also buy them now from Amazon with free shipping. The cost is \$64.95. Just go to Amazon and search for "PGPI-HC".


