Services will be held July 2nd in Kingsford. The family plans a memorial in Evanston sometime in July. Our best wishes go out to his wife, Lois.





The tour began with 21 people in West Chicago, and took a leisurely route through the Historic District of Elgin, where we picked up 5 more. In this District there are many homes that were built in the late 1800's to the early 1900's. We took the drive slow so that we could look at the architecture that makes these homes unique. It is nice to see communities make an effort to preserve a little bit of their history.

Leaving the Elgin area, we drove through the countryside where the houses are spread out, and many of the roads are great for driving these older automobiles. Our destination was in Campton Hills, which, as its name implies, meant there were a few small hills to navigate. Nothing too big though!

There were hundreds of small items displayed to complete the feeling that one is actually stepping back in time. 
