# The Best Blueberry Coffee Cake I Ever Made By Este Scheve

Cake ingredients:

2 cups all-purpose flour
2 tsp baking powder
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp salt
<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup granulated sugar
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup butter
1 egg
1 tsp vanilla
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup milk
2 cups blueberries (I used 2 pint containers)

Preheat oven to 375

Lightly grease an 8" square or 9" round pan




Streusel:

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup sugar
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup all-purpose flour
1 tsp cinnamon
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>8</sub> tsp salt
<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup butter

To make the streusel: Mix sugar, flour, cinnamon and salt in a small bowl. Cut or rub butter with side of fork or 2 knives or fingers until crumbly. Set aside.

To make the cake: Blend flour, baking powder and salt in a medium bowl. In a separate bowl, beat sugar, butter, egg and vanilla. Alternately add milk and flour mixture to sugar/butter mixture, ending with flour. Add blueberries and stir only to blend. Dough will be very thick and almost difficult to mix in berries. Pour batter into the prepared pan. Sprinkle the streusel over the batter. Bake 40-45 minutes until a toothpick comes out clean. Serve from the pan.

If not eaten immediately, do not cover top with plastic as the streusel will get soft. Cover only the cut sides. It won't last long!




- → Price from \$1,614 for the Mainline Business Coupe V-8 to \$2,403 for the Crestline Country Squire wagon.
