

I look forward to seeing you this month at our club events!


FROM THE EDITORS

This month's V-8 Gals is all about zucchini. If you have a garden you are probably swimming in zucchini this time of year. If your neighbor has a garden you probably find yourself with a bunch of extra zucchini on hand. I like zucchini but find myself limited in my zucchini recipes. I need to expand my horizon beyond zucchini bread.

On my zucchini recipe quest I learned a few things about this green vegetable. Did you know that zucchini has more potassium than a banana? It is

low in calories and a great source of vitamin A and C. You don't want to peel a zucchini because all of the nutrients are in the skin.

I found a few interesting recipes that I thought I'd try out. Here are a couple of them. Hope you like them too!

Zucchini Parmesan

- 1/2 to 1 teaspoon minced garlic
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 4 medium zucchini, cut into 1/4-inch slices
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) Italian diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 teaspoon seasoned salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese


In a large skillet, sauté garlic in oil. Add zucchini; cook and stir for 4-5 minutes or until crisp-tender.

Stir in the tomatoes, seasoned salt and pepper. Simmer, uncovered, for 9-10 minutes or until liquid is absorbed and mixture is heated through. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Serve with a slotted spoon. **Yield:** 6 servings.

Zucchini Patties

- 4 cups Zucchini, Shredded
- ½ cups All-purpose Flour
- ½ cups Shredded Parmesan Cheese
- ½ cups Shredded Mozzarella Cheese
- 2 whole Eggs (large)
- ½ cups Chopped Onion
- 2 Tablespoons Vegetable Oil

Squeeze some of the excess water from your zucchini. Combine zucchini with eggs, cheeses, and onion. Stir to combine. Add flour and salt and pepper, to taste, and stir. Heat oil in skillet on medium-high. Drop batter into oil and cook until browned on both sides, flipping once, like you would cook pancakes. Serve with sour cream.

The presence of Dick & Linda Livingston's original 1938 Standard Coupe at the Grand National Meet has started a lively discussion of this model on the Fordbarn. Continuing with that spirit, 2023 is the 85th Anniversary of the 1938 Ford. We hope you like the following interesting technical information and historical facts about this model and contemporary world events.

Firsts

- → Deluxe and Standard are now separate body styles
- → First year for the iconic "teardrop" taillight
- → Stainless beltline trim replaced pin striping
- → Taillights mounted flush into the fenders
- → Headlight dimmer switch mounted on floor
- → Convertible Coupe and Convertible Club Coupe replaced the Cabriolet designation
- → 24-stud 221 V-8 replaced the 21-stud early in the model year






