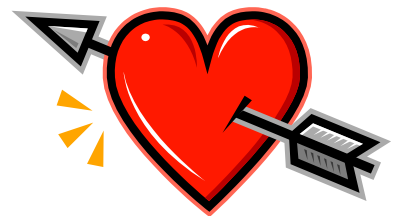

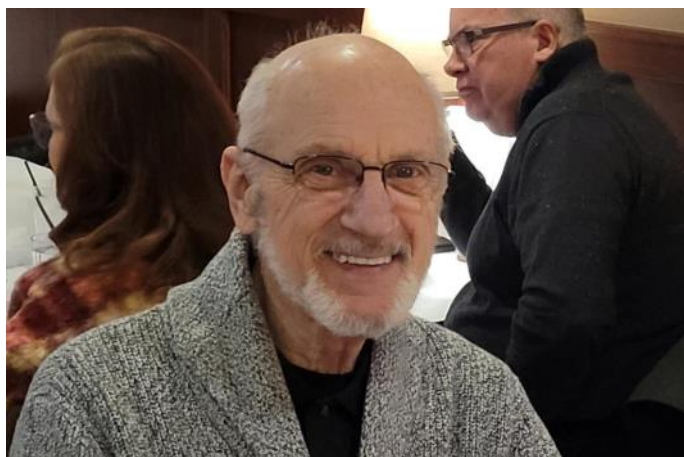

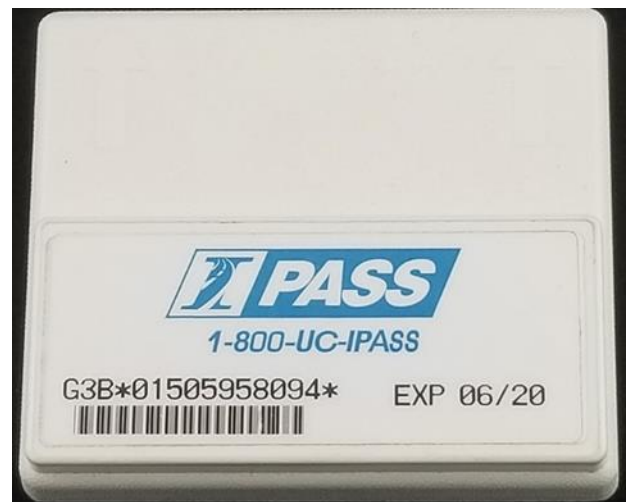

**I-Pass Sticker Tags are Here!**

Gone are the days of those bulky transponders. The new I-Pass Stickers are available now at the Illinois Tollway Customer Service Center at 2700 Ogden Ave in Downers Grove and at any tollway oasis. You may obtain a sticker for each license plate registered in your I-pass account – I picked up five of them today. The good news is that they are free! When you turn in an old transponder, the \$10 deposit will be credited to your toll account. The stickers will also be available for a service fee at Jewel-Osco and Road Ranger starting in February.

The new stickers use RFID technology, so there is no battery to run down. And they are really small. The sticker measures about 1" x 3.8", about half the size of the current "mini" transponder and much smaller than previous versions. Plus, it is paper thin. It must be permanently attached to your windshield behind the rearview mirror about 4-6" away from the metal frame. I have been using the license plate transponders on the antiques and will not miss them. With today's nice weather, I just tried one out on our Crestliner. The good news - it worked! The license plate transponder is history.

There are a couple of downsides. First, because the stickers must be permanently attached, there is no more moving them from vehicle to vehicle. Not much of a problem since they are free with no deposit, but this prevents using your I-Pass in a borrowed or rental vehicle. To do that, you must retain one of the old-style transponders. Please be aware that a specific sticker must now be associated with a specific license plate in your account. You can do that online or call I-Pass. Also know that there are special rules for vehicles with more than two axles or four tires, including those pulling trailers. Those customers must trade their transponder for a "blue" transponder.

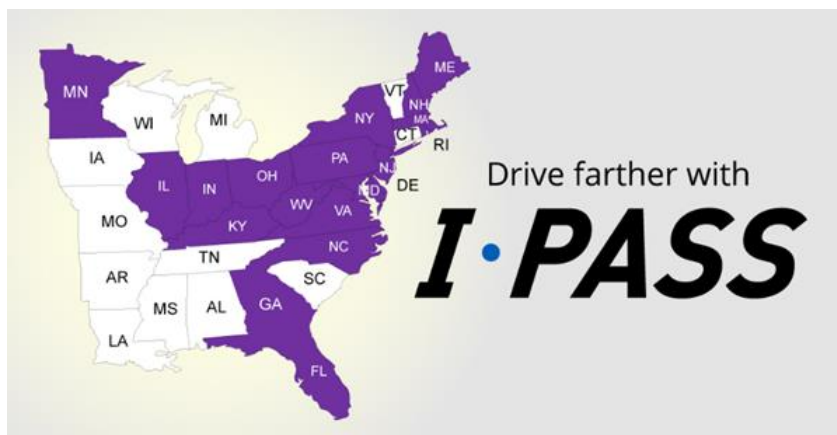

As you can see, the new stickers also have E-ZPass imprinted on them. The I-Pass sticker is accepted anywhere that E-ZPass is accepted, now including the Florida turnpike. This means that 35 toll agencies in 20 states accept the I-Pass.

Try as I might, I could not find a picture of the old original I-Pass - the big ones with the replaceable battery. I still miss the BEEP when you passed through the toll gates.

The True History of Valentines Day

Mid-February was traditionally the time of the Lupercian festival, an ode to the God of fertility and a celebration of sensual pleasure, a time to meet and court a prospective mate. In AD 496, Pope Gelasius outlawed the pagan festival. But he was clever to replace it with a similar celebration, although one deemed morally suitable. He needed a "lovers" saint to replace the pagan deity Lupercus.

The martyred Bishop Valentine was chosen as the patron saint of the new festival.

Saint Valentine had been beheaded for helping young lovers marry against the wishes of the mad emperor Claudius. Before execution, Valentine himself had fallen in love with his jailer's daughter. He signed his final note to her, "From Your Valentine", a phrase that has lasted through the centuries.

Pope Gelasius didn't get everything he wanted. The pagan festival died out, it is true, but he had further hoped people would emulate the lives of saints. Instead they latched onto the more romantic aspect of Saint Valentine's religious life. While not immediately as popular as the more passionate pagan festival, eventually the concept of celebrating true love became known as Valentine's Day.

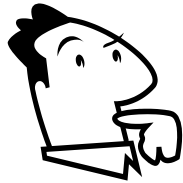

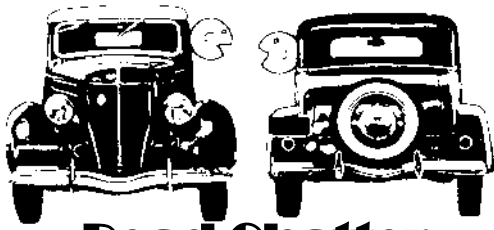
