#### Our First National Meet & A Tribute to Pops 2025 Central National Meet - Early Ford V-8 Club A V-8 Family Reunion • Springfield, Illinois • June 21-27, 2025 By Eric Kozmic

For me, 2024 happened to be one of those times that as the years go by, I'll cherish more and more. Going back to 2024, my wife Cheryl and I were able to spend the entire month of May in the Chicagoland area to help take care of things for my Dad (Joe Kozmic). His health had been slowly deteriorating over the last several years and the loss of his wife Nell Kozmic in February 2023 didn't help matters. Nell was like a 2nd Mother to my brother and me. We were luckier than we realized back then.

Both Pops and Nell made it to many National meets over the years. I would hear about the trips during my many visits to Lombard, Illinois. The stories were numerous, the tales humorous, and the wisdom imparted irreplaceable.

I visited as often as I could over the years, but May 2024 and our daily visits with Pops turned out to be the shining star for Cheryl and me. I knew at some point this could be the last one—the last visit, the last car trip, and so on. That's why I so cherished the many trips we could take together over the years in his 1953 Mercury Monterey. It was our time to catch up on life, talk about work, family, and of course have a couple of beers. I didn't know it then, but our trip to South Bend, Indiana in 2017 would be our last car trip in the Merc together. We had a blast and enjoyed hanging with the group. The fact it was to my favorite college and football team was secondary.

During May 2024, there were rumors about a possible Central National Meet. I told Pops it would be great if we could go to another meet and encouraged him to work with the physical therapists and staff specialists to get his strength up enough to where we could safely make the drive. He certainly seemed up for the trip and you could tell his spirits were

boosted by the possibility of another meet. He loved going to these meets and would gladly talk with anyone about past meets, the cities involved and the people he met along the way.

Between our visits in May 2024, I requested the assistance of Ken Bounds to help me with getting the cars back up and running. The cars were parked for about five years with full gas tanks from the last time Ken and I took them


for a drive in 2019. Lo and behold, fresh batteries and some starting fluid and they rumbled to life! Everyone was excited and we quickly relayed the news to Pops who simply said, "I knew they would, you can drive them anywhere." With fresh oil changes, new spark plugs, and some thorough car washes, the cars had never looked better.

Leaving Chicagoland at the end of May was a difficult thing to do. There's just something about a gut feeling and it turned out to be correct as we lost Pops on July 22, 2024. I was grateful to have been up there with him for his last few days. I wouldn't trade that time for anything.

Fast forward to October 2024, and we had a beautiful dinner at Barone's of Glen Ellyn and a memorial service with Military Honors at the Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery—exactly what Pops wanted. The help and support of Ken, Carolyn, and the members of the NIRGV-8 group will not be forgotten. It was great to see them all again at Pops' dinner and memorial service.

After making the necessary transportation arrangements in late October, Ken Bounds was instrumental in getting the fleet loaded up on the hauler for the trip to their new home in South Carolina.

Between July and October 2024, the plans were finalized and officially announced: the 2025 Central National Meet would be held in Springfield, Ilinois. It was then I knew I had to find a way to go. Not only for me—as it would be my first National Meet—but for Pops, who would be traveling with me and my wife in spirit. I registered us for the meet in January 2025 and was committed to attending.

As anyone knows when attending a meet, you have to make sure your car is in good running order. I talked with several members of the Early Ford V-8 Group (Upstate #163) and they assisted me with a few items and gave me ideas on others.

First on the list was a long overdue tire change in January 2025. She rode like a dream, and I managed to drive the '53 Merc for the first several months of 2025. As March and April came around, I heard a sound I hadn't heard before, and it was getting louder as the drive went on. Fortunately, there's a great garage that works on classics in the Upstate of South Carolina. They quickly determined my rear wheel bearings were in terrible shape. I told them of my planned trip to Springfield in June, and we developed a plan to get the Merc road-ready. All the fluids were replaced (transmission, differential, coolant), brake fluid flushed, front bearings inspected (and repacked), and rear wheel bearings completely replaced. I even managed to show them a

lubrication diagram of the car to ensure all the "jerk fittings" were properly greased.

Knowing June was rapidly approaching, I stayed in touch with the garage for updates. Upon picking up the car in mid May, she felt brand new as I was taking the car for a test drive. I couldn't believe how great the car drove and more importantly, sounded. The trip was still ON!

Cheryl and I ended up leaving the Upstate of South Carolina on June 19, 2025. We didn't check on the roads that morning, but apparently I-40 through the mountains of NC/TN had just experienced a mudslide earlier in the week. As a result, there was a detour through the mountains that would add about 1—2 hours onto the trip to our planned overnight stop in Louisville, Kentucky, where we had arranged to participate in some distillery tours.

The car performed beautifully. She handled the mountain roads and detours quite well. The only bad weather we encountered on the way to Springfield was rain on Day 1. Louisville is a great city with plenty to see and do. On Saturday morning, we departed Louisville for Springfield, planning to arrive around lunchtime to begin assisting members of the NIRGV-8 group with meeting prep and setup. It was great to see the NIRGV-8 group I've

met many times and get in on the early action of the meet before the fun really started and folks started arriving with their cars and trailers.

Between the tireless work of Ken and Carolyn Bounds and several members of the NIRGV-8 chapter, they really outdid themselves with the activities and events planned. Being this was our first meet, I signed up for several events including the Lincoln Presidential Museum and Tour, touring the only home President Lincoln owned, guided tour of the Dana Thomas House (designed by Frank Lloyd Wright) and a driving tour on the world famous Route 66. Cheryl even raved about meeting "President Lincoln" during the Ladies Luncheon arranged by Este Scheve.

I especially enjoyed meeting and speaking with several folks who remembered meeting my Dad during previous National Meets. The meets he attended resulted in him traveling over 25,000 miles and multiple cities over many years in either his 1937 Ford Coupe or the 1953 Mercury Monterey. Everyone had stories about Pops, and I must say it was humbling to hear each and every one of them. For those of you who came up to Cheryl and me, I want to personally say "Thank You." You don't know how special it was to hear a story about Pops or the car he drove to the meet back in the day. He certainly was a character and definitely one of a kind.

Based on recent news reports, there was a Heat Dome predicted for the entire Midwest during the same week of the meet. For once, the meteorologists were correct! It was quite hot with temps in the mid / upper 90's most of the week with the "feels like" temperature closer to triple digits.

After mandatory Operations Checks (a thorough safety inspection led by Jim Brown), Judging Day was Wednesday, June 25, and the stage was set for all the cars on the concourse to be judged. Staying hydrated was the goal of the day, and you could tell the judges, along with everyone else on the

Our Awards Banquet was held on Thursday evening and the suspense was building for all the members whose cars were judged. Just like back in school, everyone was asking "how do you think you did?" We wouldn't know until after our wonderful Awards Dinner was emceed by our National Chief Judge, Ken Bounds.

It seems like the suspense was building with every minute of the dinner. I could hear conversations not only at our table, but in speaking with others before dinner at the cocktail reception as well as during the dinner. I was hopeful all of our preparations were going to be worth it. Between tying up last minute items to try and minimize any possible deductions, sometimes you just never know until the very end.

There were so many beautiful cars at this event to be judged and points tabulated. Once Ken got to the Mercury section, it seemed like time stood still. I bowed my head and asked for some help from Pops. Once Ken started talking and mentioned how special it was to present a Dearborn Award to the son of the Best Man at his wedding, I realized the hard work paid off. I was truly humbled and proud at the same time to go up and accept the Dearborn Plaque from our National President. Dave Gunnarson. I know Pops would've been proud as well. He was with us that trip—no doubt in my mind. As I walked up to the front to accept the award, I heard Pops say, "You did good, Son."

Cheryl and I were quite excited to receive the Dearborn award. (PS - It's already on proud display in our basement on our Automotive



She sent us two while she was hanging out with Eric and Cheryl at Hilton Head.

#### Bermuda Triangle

The name of this cocktail is inspired by the infamous Bermuda Triangle, a region in the North Atlantic Ocean where strange disappearances have occurred. Just like the mysterious phenomenon, this cocktail will have you feeling like you're lost in a world of deliciousness. The spiced rum brings a warm and rich depth to the drink, making it the perfect choice for a hot summer day.

- ⇒ 1 shot Captain Morgan spiced rum
- ⇒ 1 shot Peach Schnapps
- $\Rightarrow$  3 oz orange juice
- ⇒ Splash of grenadine

Pour all ingredients over ice in a lowball glass, stir and serve, Wedge of lime optional.



#### **Back Nine Cocktail**

OK, Erica threw us a curve on this one. There are several variations of this cocktail, but none like this one served at the Quarterdeck at the Lighthouse Inn on Hilton Head Island. Erica didn't send us the proportions, so we suggest you experiment. It sure looks tasty.

- ⇒ Bulrush Gin
- ⇒ Blueberry syrup
- ⇒ Club soda
- ⇒ Key West lime juice
- ⇒ Giffard ginger

Bulrush Gin is made on Hilton Head and is available in limited areas, so you may need to substitute. Giffard ginger is available at Total Wine.
